## How Hempstead Town Allocated \$133.8 Million of Federal CARES Money

The Town of Hempstead received \$133.8 million from the Federal Government to be used to provide economic relief to those negatively effected by the COVID-19 pandemic. Although the Town Supervisor, Don Clavin has claimed the Town has been transparent (see <u>Dec. 27th Newsday Article</u>), the resolutions, especially those that distribute funds to Town departments, provide little detail.
