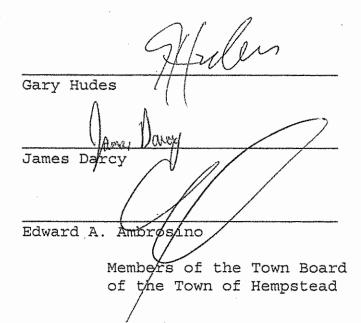

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF HEMPSTEAD, NEW YORK, ADOPTED ______, 2014, AUTHORIZING THE FINANCING OF THE ACQUISITION OF REAL PROPERTY TO INCREASE AND IMPROVE THE FACILITIES FOR THE FRANKLIN SQUARE PARK DISTRICT, STATING THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IS \$3,625,000, APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,625,000 SERIAL BONDS OF SAID TOWN TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION

The following resolution was offered by _______, who moved its adoption, seconded by _______ to wit: THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF HEMPSTEAD (THE "TOWN"), IN THE COUNTY OF NASSAU, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES (by the favorable vote of not less than twothirds of all members of said Town Board) AS FOLLOWS:
