The town continues to create new relationships and foster established relationships between business owners, community groups and SPLASH. SPLASH is a volunteer cleanup group. New volunteers are recruited during cleanup events as well as through local advertising.

Question 7B - MCM 2 - Observations of Measurable Goals

SPLASH is a volunteer cleanup group. New volunteers are recruited during cleanup events as well as through local advertising. The town has published and distributed over 1 million informational pamphlets to educate the public on how to become involved and partner with the town to maintain clean and pollutant free water flows. The town has implemented and received public support and participation in the Goose and Park Cleanup events. The Town has fully expanded the community hot line to include 24-hour public access to report environmentally unsafe practices to help the Town identify sources of pollution and as an enforcement aid against illicit discharge controls.

Question 6A - MCM 5 - Post Construction measurable goals

- In combination with the public outreach program identified above the Town continues to identify and inspect the known possible sources of illicit discharge.

- The town continues to sample wells on Town land with the contracted assistance of an environmental engineering firm.

The Town actively seeks out any source of contamination within its control area and through its practice of inspecting stormwater sewers through the use of video cameras we have been able to identify possible problem areas and has fixed the drainage as a preventative measure. Wells on Town land are sampled with the contracted assistance of an environmental engineering firm. Fertilization and maintenance of privately owned facilities and lands is being monitored, when the facility is large (i.e. golf course). The

Town has erected salt domes and is in the process of rebuilding the Merrick transfer station and vehicle storage and maintenance facilities.

Question 6A – MCM 6 - Measurable goals

The Town of Hempstead through the Supervisor and Town Board assign responsibility for its buildings, facilities, marinas, parkland and structures to the various departments within the Town government. Those same department head/supervisor is responsible for the implementation of the plan as it applies to that activity. The day-to-day responsibility for implementation of the municipal plan is delegated to the department supervisor of the particular operation/activity in question. The area supervisor is responsible to correct any known spill or possible contaminant as per the municipal plan. The spill or contaminated area is evaluated and based on that information or observation the supervisor implements the necessary procedure to correct or mitigate the spill. All incidents are to be reported to the Department head and then to the Stormwater Officer.

Question 6B – MCM 6 – Observation of Measurable goals

The Town continues to insert filters into existing storm basins and plans to continue the project until completed.

Question 6F - MCM 6 -Planned Activities Measurable goals

Future plans include installing additional filters in catch basins. The Town of Hempstead is conducting a departmental review of procedures and policies. Upon completion of this review the Town will revise, update and add to this plan as may be determined by the review. The review includes but is not limited to storage and application of all fertilizers, storage of petroleum products, vehicles and associated debris, storage and retention of sand, salted sand, topsoil, mulch, grass clippings, leaves and other foliage, storage of chemicals for printing and reproduction. Once the review is completed the new plan will be distributed to the relevant department heads or their representative for full implementation and adherence.

- A. Company requires 7 x 24 Telephone Support consisting of Level 1 and Problem Determination Support for their FLEX-ES based mainframe server. Company also requires annual Level 2 & 3 Support and Maintenance from Fundamental Software, Inc., and continued maintenance for Fundamental Software, Inc. provided hardware, specifically: (3) parallel channel production system and (1) parallel channel disaster recovery system.
- B. Contractor is a provider of Level 1 and Problem Determination Support for FLEX-ES based mainframe servers. Problem Determination consists of researching the cause of hardware and software issues and determining where the problem resides. Dear Mr. Ra:

This Agreement is between the Town of Hempstead ("Client") and Park Strategies, LLC ("Consultant") and relates to consulting services rendered by Consultant as an advisor to Client with respect to strategic planning, and government relations. Specifically, Consultant shall furnish to and on behalf of Client those services set forth at Schedule A, which is hereby incorporated into the Agreement.

The term of this Agreement shall commence as of the date that it is fully executed and continue for a period of twelve (12) calendar months commencing on June 1, 2014. This term, as well as other provisions of the Agreement, may be modified only pursuant to the mutual written agreement of Client and Consultant. The Town of Hempstead may cancel this contract for any reason upon thirty (30) days written notice to the consultant.

In consideration of such aforementioned consulting services rendered or to be rendered, Client will pay to Consultant \$12,500 per month, due and payable on the 1st day of each month, with the exception of the first monthly fee, which is due upon the execution of this Agreement.

Client and Consultant hereby acknowledge that some of the services to be furnished hereunder may constitute "lobbying activity" as that term is defined in federal, state, and local laws, rules and regulations. As such, Client hereby expressly authorizes Consultant to engage in lobbying activity on its behalf during the effective term of this Agreement. Client and Consultant also acknowledge that both Client and Consultant shall be required, from time to time, to make periodic filings and disclosures with those entities that exercise jurisdiction over lobbying activity, including, but not limited to, the Clerk of the U.S. House of Representatives, the Secretary of the U.S. Senate, and the New York State Joint Commission on Public Ethics. Consultant hereby represents and warrants that it shall, at all times during the effective term of this Agreement, carry out its performance under this Agreement in full compliance with any and all applicable laws, rules, and regulations that govern the provision of the services to be furnished hereunder. In addition, Consultant further warrants that it shall use its best efforts to assist Client in meeting any disclosure and reporting obligations that Client may have by virtue of the services Consultant provides during the effective term of this Agreement, and any extension thereof.

All information which the Consultant presently has or which may come into Consultant's possession during the engagement relative to the business activities of Client or its clients which is of a secret or confidential nature is and shall remain the property of Client. Consultant shall not, during the engagement or thereafter, disclose to others or use for the benefit of others or itself any such information so long as such information is treated as secret or confidential by Client.

If Consultant shall be subject to any claim, demand or penalty or become a party to any suit or other judicial or administrative proceeding by reason of any claimed act or omission by Client, or by reason of any act occurring in connection with the provision of services hereunder, the Client shall indemnify and hold Consultant harmless against all judgments, settlements, penalties and expenses, including attorneys fees, court costs and other expenses of litigation or administrative proceeding, incurred by or imposed on Consultant in connection with the investigation or defense relating to such claim or litigation or administrative proceeding and, at the election of Consultant, Client shall also defend Consultant.

This Agreement shall be binding upon and insure to the benefit of the parities hereto and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors and assigns where permitted by this Agreement.

In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provisions thereof and this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal and unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

This Agreement may be executed in any number of identical counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, and all of which together shall be deemed to be one and the same instrument when each party has signed on such counterpart.

In the event any of the terms, conditions, or provisions of this Agreement are held to be illegal, unenforceable or invalid by any court of the competent jurisdiction, the legality, validity, and unenforceability of the remaining terms, conditions or provisions shall not be affected thereby.

This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York, without reference to choice of law doctrine.
