3. Scope of Contract Library Services

The District hereby contracts for, and The Library hereby agrees to provide, library services to district residents. Library services for district residents means that district residents are entitled to the full and unlimited access to and the use of the Malverne Public Library as if district residents were residents of the Incorporated Village of Malverne. Library services for district residents shall also include unrestricted access to and use of all Nassau Library System services including inter-library loan all to the extent that such services are presently or hereafter available to village residents. If District residents are denied full access to Nassau Library System services, the District may seek to amend or terminate this contract as provided for by paragraph 8 herein.

4. Library Cards

Upon completion of the library's standard application form for membership, the library shall issue district residents its regular library card which is identical in every respect to those cards issued to village residents.

However, the cards for district residents may have endorsed thereon an expiration date or renewal date, which

coincides with the expiration date of the contract funding such services.

.5. Term

This contract is for a three (3) year term commencing January 1, 2016 and terminating December 31, 2018.

6. <u>Consideration</u>

The District shall pay to the Library the annual sum of \$21,717.16 together with a 1% cost of living adjustment for the third year of the contract. There is no adjustment in the second year of the contract.

There will be no cost of living adjustment in the second year of the contract. The first installment for each year shall be due and payable on April 1st for services between January 1st and June 30th and the second installment for each year shall be due and payable on October 1st for services between July 1st and December 31st. Payment shall be made directly to the Malverne Public Library.

Minimum Control Measure 3 (MCM 3) Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination

Question 12A - MCM 3 - Measurable Goals SWPPP

The Town has established an inspection plan that calls for monthly inspections of identified trouble/problematic areas. The Town has fostered its relationship with SPLASH a volunteer organization that organizes, educates and participates in volunteer efforts to clean up the bay and low lying areas close or at the waterline. Through this partnership the Town is able to expand both public involvement and public participation in identifying sources of pollution, cleaning up potential pollutants and is able to expand the use of the Town's hotlines.

Question 12B - MCM 3 - Observations Effectiveness of SWPPP

Through the partnership with SPLASH, the Town has held cleanup events for the public at large and conducts routine, usually daily, boat trips to the shoreline of remote areas to inspect and if necessary clear and clean the affected areas. Through the diligence of the Town workforce and the help of the volunteer organization SPLASH and the general public the bays are cleaner.

Question 12F - MCM 3 - Planned Storm water Activities

The Town continues retrofitting all its storm drains to include the proper filtration and separation of contaminant bodies. This work has been ongoing; The Town of Hempstead will install more this coming year.

Question 12F - MCM 3 (cont'd)

Through the partnership with SPLASH the Town has held cleanup events for the public at large and conducts routine boat trips to the shoreline of remote areas to inspect and if necessary clear and clean the affected areas. The Town continues to expand relationship between SPALSH and itself to further both public awareness and public participation with both detecting and preventing and removing the source of any contaminant and its source.

Minimum Control Measure 4 (MCM 4) Construction Stormwater Runoff Control

Question 7A-MCM 4 - Measurable goals

All SWPPP's received were reviewed and all were returned with comments. All of the returns reflected the standards as outlined in the NYS Standards. The Town returns all submitted SWPPP's within ten (10) business days of receipt and is available to engineers and designers for the latest websites and/or links so that they may comply with the standards. Contractors continue to be informed and updated by the Town as often as is necessary to maintain cogent plan implementation.

Question 7B – MCM 4 - Observation of Measurable goals

Developers are aware of the new requirements and have been filing SWPPP's with their Building Department submittals. The SWPPP's are forwarded through intra-departmental mail to the Dep't of Engineering for review, and ultimately either rejection with comments or approval of the pre-construction, construction and post-construction BMP's.

Question 7F- MCM 4 -Planned goals for upcoming year

The Town through the Department of Engineering has implemented Erosion and Sediment Control Plans for properties over one acre.

Minimum Control Measure- MCM 5 Post-Construction Stormwater Management

Question 6A - MCM 5 - Post Construction measurable goals

- In combination with the public outreach program identified above the Town continues to identify and inspect the known possible sources of illicit discharge.
- The Town actively seeks out any source of contamination within its control area.
- It has implemented a practice of inspecting storm water sewers through the use of video cameras.
- The town continues to sample wells on Town land with the contracted assistance of an environmental engineering firm.
- The Town also implemented a plan for the fertilization and maintenance of Town owned facilities and lands.

Question 6B – MCM 5 – Post Construction observations

The Town actively seeks out any source of contamination within its control area and through its practice of inspecting storm water systems through the use of video cameras we have been able to identify possible problem areas. We remediate the problem sections of pipe as a preventative measure. Wells on Town land are sampled with the contracted assistance of an environmental engineering firm.

Minimum Control Measure 6 (MCM 6) Stormwater Management for Municipal Operations

Question 6A – MCM 6 - Measurable goals

The individual Department Commissioner/supervisor is responsible for the implementation of the plan as it applies to their department. The day-to-day responsibility for implementation of the municipal plan is delegated by the department to a supervisor of the particular operation/activity in question. The area supervisor is responsible to correct any known spill or possible contaminant as per the municipal plan. The spill or contaminated area is evaluated and based on that information or observation the supervisor implements the necessary procedure to correct or mitigate the spill. All incidents are to be reported to the Department head and then to the Department of Engineering.

The Town continues to insert filters into existing storm basins and plans to continue the project until completed.

- § 96-5.1. Fees for certain off-street parking variances.
- A. Each place of public assembly which shall commence initial and lawful operation after the effective date of this section, and which has received a variance from the Board of Appeals, authorizing operation with less than the number of off-street parking spaces required under the Building Zone Ordinance, shall be obligated, prior to issuance of an initial public assembly license, to pay to the Department of Buildings the fee of \$3,000 for each required off-street parking space waived by the Board of Appeals, except that no such payment shall be required for the first five parking spaces waived.
- B. This obligation shall not apply in the case of off-street parking variances granted in connection with applications for alterations or expansions of places of public assembly that are lawfully in operation on the effective date of this section, for so long as there shall be no change of the type of public assembly use operating at the time of the grant.
- C. All fees collected hereunder shall be transferred to the Department of General Services and devoted to the increase and improvement of public parking fields in the Town.

A local law to enact a new section 128-61-1 of Chapter 128 of the Code of the Town of Hempstead, in relation to Foreclosures, Undertakings and Maintenance of Premises.

Introduced by:

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Hempstead as follows:

Section 1. Article V of Chapter 128 of the code of the town of Hempstead, as constituted by local law number fifty-eight of nineteen hundred eighty-nine, hereby is amended to enact a new section 128-61-1, and shall henceforth read as follows:

Chapter 128 Garbage and Rubbish

* * *

§ 128-61-1 Foreclosures; Undertaking. Legislative Intent: When residential properties in the Town of Hempstead fall vacant and become the subject of foreclosure actions, they frequently become neglected and overgrown with grass, weeds and rubbish, creating an unsightly appearance in the surrounding residential area and detracting from the use, enjoyment and value of surrounding properties. The Town of Hempstead is committed to using all legal avenues to proactively address these adverse conditions, to alleviate the burden these vacant properties impose on neighboring residents. This new section 128-66-1 places the financial burden on any person, business, organization, bank or lender who commences a foreclosure action against any vacant residential property in the Town of Hempstead to deposit funds with the Town after the foreclosure action is commenced, for use in achieving prompt remediation, if or when it shall occur. This new law is clearly in the public interest. It will help deter violations by creating a financial disincentive against allowing the property to lie fallow and unmaintained. It will help to expedite remediation of overgrown grass, weeds and rubbish, when they occur. It will also help avoid substantial outlays of public funds in accomplishing same. Any person, business, organization, bank or lender who commences a foreclosure action against a residential property (improved with a single-family, two-family or multiple family residence) that has become vacant shall provide to the Town of Hempstead an undertaking in the form of cash, a cash bond,

or a letter of credit acceptable to the Town Attorney, in the sum of \$25,000.00, to secure the continued maintenance of the property free of any violations of section 128-61-1 of this Chapter, during the entire time that vacancy shall exist, as determined by the Commissioner of Sanitation. When the foreclosure action is finally discontinued, any unused funds shall be returned.

- B. It shall be unlawful for any such person, business, organization, bank or lender to fail to properly deposit such cash, a cash bond, or a letter of credit within 45 calendar days after the foreclosure action is commenced.
- C. In the event that the Commissioner of Sanitation determines that any property referenced in paragraph "A" above is being maintained in violation of section 128-61-1 of this Chapter, then in addition to or in lieu of any other enforcement remedy at his disposal, the Commissioner may utilize the deposited funds to pay the full and actual cost of actions necessary to eliminate the violation.
- D. In the event that any such funds are utilized as set forth above, such person, business, organization, bank or lender shall restore it to the full amount referenced in paragraph "A" above, within 15 calendar days after written demand by the Town of Hempstead, sent by regular mail and certified mail, return receipt requested to such person, business, organization, bank or lender at an address designated by them for service of notices, or else to their last known address. It shall be unlawful for such person business, organization, bank or lender to fail to timely restore funds as required herein.
- E. In the event that the Commissioner of Sanitation determines that any property referenced in paragraph "A" above is being maintained in violation of section 128-61-1 of this Chapter and no cash, cash bond, or letter of credit acceptable to the Town Attorney has been provided or replenished as required by paragraphs A or D above, then in addition to or in lieu of any other enforcement remedy at his disposal, the Commissioner may serve a written demand upon such person, business, organization, bank or lender to provide the required cash, cash bond, or letter of credit acceptable to the Town Attorney, within 10 days after the date of such written demand, subject to the following:
- (1) The 45 day time allotment of paragraph B hereof is superceded;
- (2) The written demand shall be served in any manner authorized to obtain personal service under Article 3 of the Civil Practice Law and Rules of the State of New York, or otherwise at applicable law; and
- (3) In the event that no cash, cash bond, or letter of credit acceptable to the Town Attorney has been provided or replenished as required by paragraphs A or D above, within 10 days after the date of such written demand, then such person, business, organization, bank or lender shall be subject to fines of up to triple the maximum amount set forth under section 128-65.A of this Chapter, with each calendar day of failure to timely provide same constituting a separate additional offense, as set forth under section 128-65.B of this Chapter.
- F. If any provision of this section 128-66-1 is declared unenforceable for any reason by a court of competent

jurisdiction, such declaration shall affect only that provision, and shall not affect the remainder of this section, which shall remain in full force and effect.

G. This section 128-66-1 shall apply to all foreclosures commencing after the effective date of this local law. It is to be considered remedial legislation and shall be liberally construed so that substantial justice is done.
