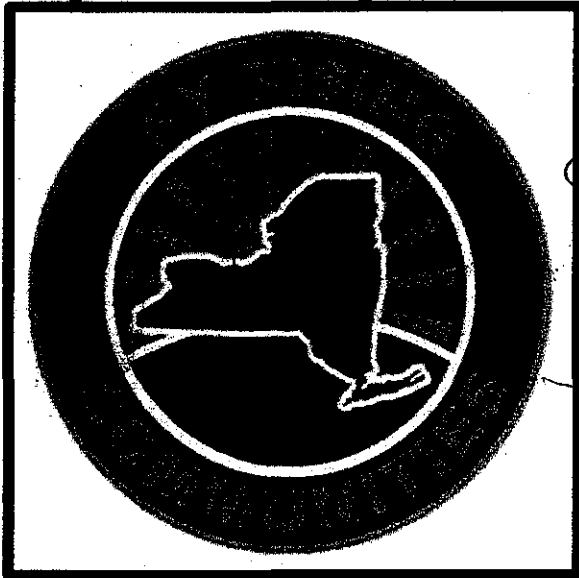



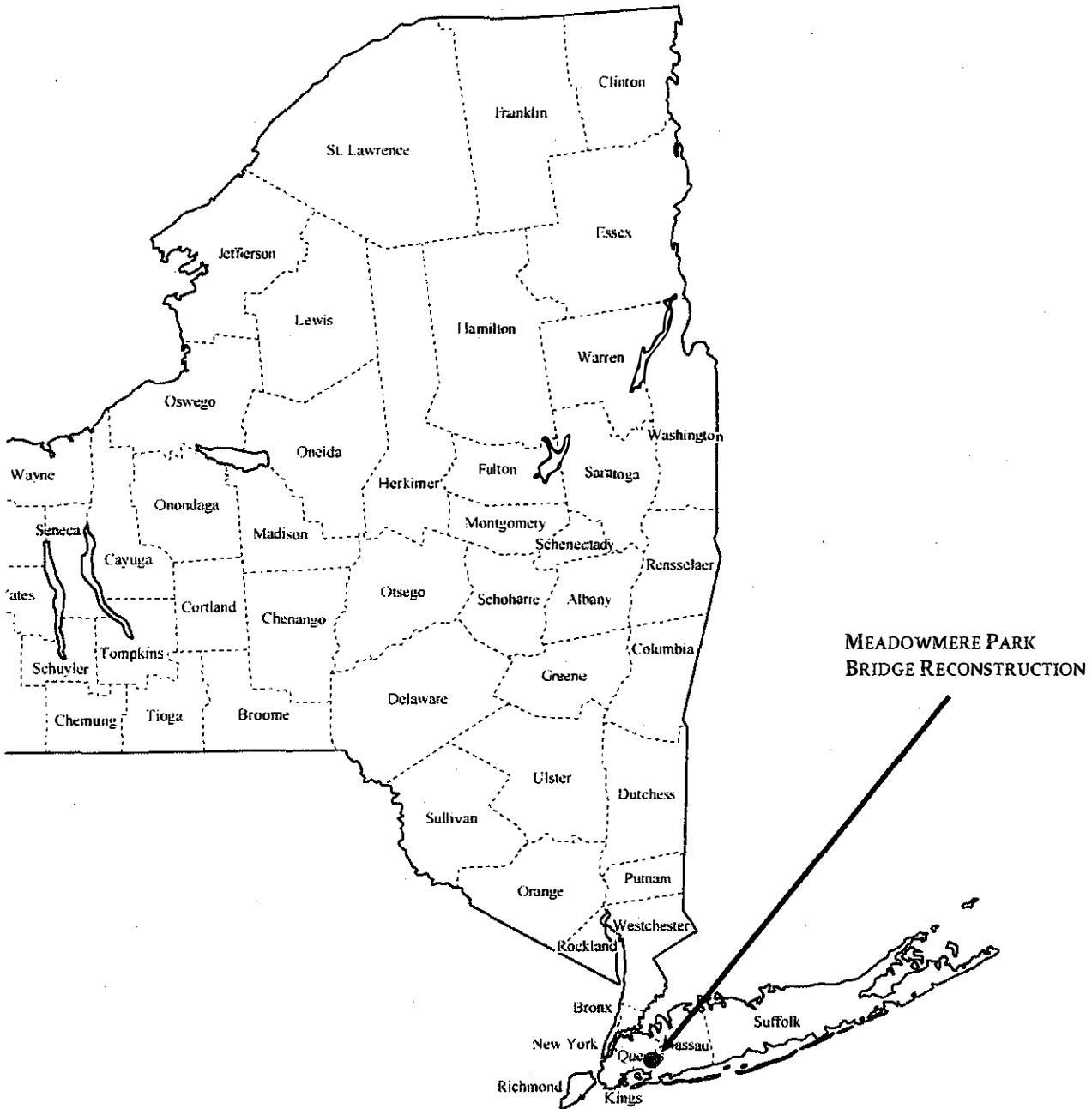

VICINITY MAP

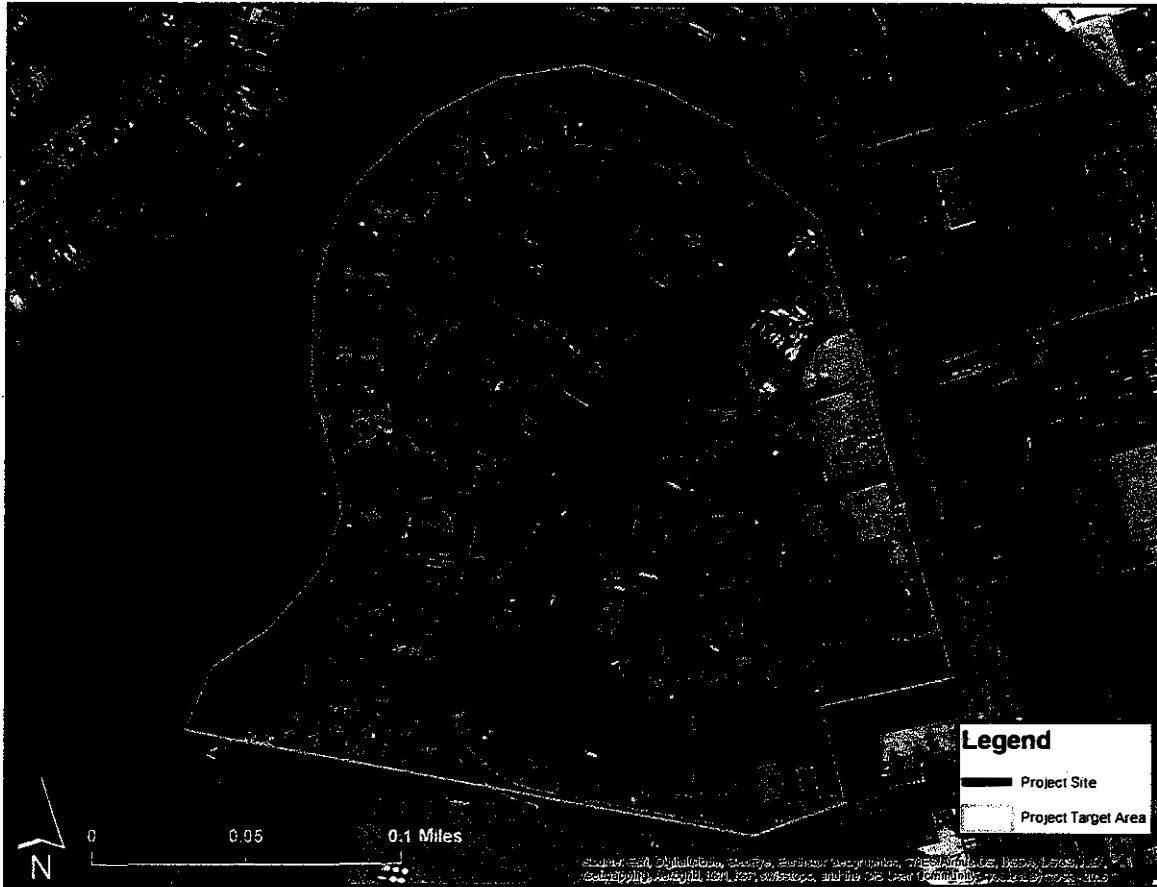
Project Name: Meadowmere Park Bridge Reconstruction³

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Comprehensive Description:

The Town of Hempstead is requesting CDBG-DR funding for the reconstruction of the Meadowmere Park Bridge which connects Meadowmere Park, Nassau County, to Meadowmere, Queens County.

The Meadowmere Park Footbridge is a critical access point for residents, as there is only one road onto the peninsula of Meadowmere Park. The bridge was damaged by Superstorm Sandy and other recent heavy storms, including Tropical Storm Irene. The Town of Hempstead has completed small repairs of the footbridge, but the bridge requires extensive reconstruction in order to withstand future storm surges and the impacts of sea level rise as well as to allow for emergency vehicle access to the community. This project would reconstruct and harden the existing wooden footbridge while maintaining the footbridge's character and use for pedestrian access. The footbridge capacity would be increased to allow for emergency vehicles to cross in times of future storm events. Vehicular access will only be allowed for emergency personnel. The bridge width will accommodate one-way vehicle traffic when access is granted.

Reconstruction and hardening of the footbridge will ensure the continued availability of an important, alternative (second) evacuation route for community residents and provide additional access and egress point for emergency vehicles during and after storm events.

Project Context:

The reconstruction and hardening of the Meadowmere Park Footbridge is a separate project and does not rely on any other project that would trigger CDBG-DR requirements.

Beneficiaries/Public Benefit/Target Area:

According to the 2010 Census, there are 68 residents of Meadowmere Park, and this project will benefit all of these residents as well as the 125 residents located on the Queens County side of the bridge in Meadowmere. The benefits to the residents include:

- **Health and Social Benefits:** The proposed project would allow for pedestrian residents to safely evacuate from the peninsula prior to a disaster (the existing roadway is not as pedestrian friendly). The Meadowmere Park Fire Department is the only public facility on the peninsula and reconstructing a new bridge will allow for better emergency vehicle access in times of an emergency.
- **Risk Reduction and Resiliency Benefits:** This project would reduce the vulnerability of residents and visitors in Meadowmere Park by providing alternatives for evacuation efforts and by allowing residents to move to safe areas on the mainland.

Recovery Rationale:

This project addresses an unmet recovery need from the following declared disaster(s):

- Superstorm Sandy
- Hurricane Irene

This project is tied to the storm in multiple ways. The Meadowmere Park Footbridge is an important community asset because it is one of two points of access to the island, the other being another vehicular bridge along East Avenue. Reconstructing and hardening the bridge is necessary to ensure that it is available as a point of egress for residents evacuating and a point of ingress for first responders for future storm events.

The Town of Hempstead is seeking CDBG-DR funds on behalf of the Meadowmere Park community to reconstruct the Meadowmere Park Footbridge to help ensure that there is accessibility for pedestrians and emergency vehicles during future emergencies.

This project directly addresses the impacts of Superstorm Sandy. Stormwaters inundated the entire community and damaged the Meadowmere Park Footbridge. The bridge is a critical access point for residents and first responders, it is one of two routes on and off of Meadowmere Park. The reconstruction and hardening of the bridge provides for increase access for emergency vehicles during and after storm events and provides an additional evacuation route and withstand the impact from future storm surges and the impacts of sea level rise.

The entire community of Meadowmere Park was inundated from tidal waters. The surge passed through Jamaica Bay to Head of Bay, adjacent to John F. Kennedy airport. Meadowmere Park is a low-lying peninsula with no natural barrier protections. During tidal flooding events, stormwater cannot drain properly, as occurred during Superstorm Sandy and Hurricane Irene.

This project is critical to the community's long term recovery from Superstorm Sandy and its resiliency in future storm events. The reconstruction and hardening of the Meadowmere Park Bridge would ensure the continued availability of this important, alternative (second) evacuation route for community residents during future emergencies. The bridge will also be used by emergency vehicles during future emergencies.

Description of Construction Involved:

The reconstruction of the bridge may require replacement of the bridge. It is expected that the reconstructed bridge would occupy the same footprint as the existing bridge.

An environmental review identifying impacts and mitigation is required. The level of any environmental review will be determined by the Governor's Office of Storm Recovery (GOSR), and the environmental review will be conducted and managed by GOSR, as NEPA/SEQRA Lead Agency. Engineering plans and

an environmental assessment will be submitted to regulatory agencies for review and permit approval in accordance with federal, state, and local regulations.

Responsibility for Operations and Maintenance:

The Town of Hempstead will be responsible for maintaining the Meadowmere Park Footbridge.

Description of Acquisition Involved:

No acquisitions anticipated for the project. If during the engineering design phase, it is determined additional property is required, the Town will comply with the Uniform Relocation and Assistance Act in the acquiring of property or rights-of-way.

Mitigation Plan:

During the design process, the engineers will be asked to give special consideration to construction measures that protect assets from wave overtopping and future storm damage, utilize storm and wave barrier best management practices, and incorporate resilient design principals for infrastructure construction.

CDBG-DR Eligibility:

The Disaster Relief Appropriations Act, 2013 (Pub. L. 113-2, approved January 29, 2013) (Appropriations Act) makes available \$16,000,000,000 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for necessary expenses related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, restoration of infrastructure and housing, and economic revitalization in the most impacted and distressed areas resulting from a major disaster declared pursuant to the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.) (Stafford Act), due to Hurricane Sandy and other eligible events in calendar years 2011, 2012, and 2013.

The project is eligible as a CDBG-DR *Public Facilities and Improvements* project pursuant to Section 105(a)(2) of the Housing and Community Development Act (HCDA), which stipulates that CDBG-DR funds may be used for acquisition, construction, reconstruction, or installation that promote energy efficiency) of public works, facilities (except for buildings for the general conduct of government), and site or other improvements.⁶

W I T N E S S E T H:

WHEREAS, the Town of Hempstead has determined that in
view of the significant and complex relationship between the
Town and the New York State Legislature, it is necessary and
desirable to retain the services of a legislative consultant
for the 2016 legislative session who can represent the Town's
interests in Albany, New York, on a regular basis; and

WHEREAS, Mark L. Lieberman, Esq., is by skill, training
and experience qualified to render such services, and in the
past has represented other governmental entities before the
Legislature.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

1. Consultant, as a legislative consultant, shall represent and protect the Town's interests before the New York State Legislature in Albany, New York, with the Consultant's fee prescribed herein serving as Consultant's sole remuneration.

2. Consultant shall be available for the purpose of consultation and advice on news and events in Albany, New York. Further, the Consultant agrees to consult with the Supervisor and the Town Board with regard to the Town's current interests in Albany.

3. Consultant shall perform his services for the duration of the entire 2017 legislative session.

4. In consideration of the services to be rendered by the Consultant under this agreement, the Town agrees to pay the sum of \$36,000.00. The fee specified shall be paid in twelve (12) equal installments of \$3,000.00, on a monthly basis beginning January 1, 2017, and upon the submission to the Town Comptroller of a properly executed and certified claim therefor.

It is understood and agreed that the fee set forth therein will be the only charge that shall be made by the Consultant, and no extra or additional charges shall be made for material, communication, traveling, consultation, or items of a similar nature for the services contemplated by this agreement.

5. The Town shall have the right to suspend or terminate the services for which the Consultant herein is engaged at any time and for any reason deemed to be in the Town's interest. In such event, the Consultant shall be paid such part of the fee as shall have been determined to compensate fairly the Consultant, in the opinion of the Town, for work done by him. Such suspension or termination shall not give rise to any cause of action for damages or for extra remuneration against the Town.

6. The Consultant, in accordance with his status as an independent contractor, covenants and agrees that he will conduct himself consistent with such status, that he will neither hold himself out as nor claim to be an officer or employee of the Town, including but not limited to Workers'

Compensation coverage, health insurance, unemployment insurance benefits, Social Security, or retirement membership or credit.

7. The Consultant and any subconsultant will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, color, sex, marital status, or national origin. The Consultant will take affirmative action to insure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, creed, color, sex, marital status or national origin.
