16	1, it is subject of litigation and Number 2,
17	we are going to setup where we are going to
18	meet with some of the people involved.

22	date and the reason is because this law, I
23	believe, is illegal under the Town Zoning

4	AUTO REPAIR, INC. & FOREVA REALTY, LLC. for a
5	special exception (public garage) to permit
6	operation of an automobile repair shop -
7	ELMONT - northeast corner of Hempstead
8	Turnpike & Clinton Street.
9	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Good Morning, Mr.
10	Avertine.
11	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Good Morning,
12	Supervisor Santino, Members of the Board:
13	Appearing for the applicant, Howard
14	Avertine. 575 Underhill Boulevard, Syosset.
15	This is the application of Signature
16	Auto Repair Incorporated and Foreva Realty,
17	LLC. for a Special Exception in order to
18	permit operation of an auto repair shop.
19	I would like to state at the outset,
20	that this is an application solely for auto
21	repairs.
22	There will be no bodywork, no
23	painting, strictly auto repairs at this shop.
24	The premises is located at the
25	northeast corner of Hempstead Turnpike and

1	Clinton Street in Elmont.
2	It has a frontage of one hundred and
3	four feet on Hempstead Turnpike and a
4	frontage of 101.88 feet on Clinton Street.
5	It has a street address of 1278
6	Hempstead Turnpike.
7	It is also known as Section 33, Block
8	368, Lots 20 through 24 on the Nassau County
9	Land and Tax Map.
10	The Petitioner, Foreva Realty, LLC. is
11	the owner of the property, that entity took
12	title by virtue of Tax Deed issued by Nassau
13	County in 2013.
14	Signature Auto Repair is the tenant
15	pursuant to a lease with the owner which was
16	executed early 2016 and, um, they are also
17	the operator of the facility.
18	The premise is zoned HTE-HB Overlay
19	District with an underlying Business District
20	designation.
21	The premise is improved with a one-
22	story block building.
23	It was approved for use as a gasoline
24	service station until 1961 pursuant to Town
25	Board Resolution Number 1100-1961 and

1	Building Permit Number 6106884.
2	The premises was utilized for many
3	years as a gasoline service station, most
4	recently as a PETRO Service Station.
5	In 2011, a failure of one of the
6	gasoline storage tanks was discovered.
7	The owner, at that time, took no steps
8	to address or remediate the problem.
9	As a result, the New York State
10	Department of Environmental Conversation took
11	over the litigation process which is still
12	ongoing.
13	The contractor came by the Department
14	of Environmental Conservation for that
15	purpose, has a trailer on the property, which
16	I am sure the Inspection Report indicates and
17	which is visible from some photographs that
18	are in the file.
19	They also have other equipment in
20	connection with the remediation which is
21	located on the northwest portion of the
22	premises.
23	Just to emphasize, all of this
24	activity, um, the gasoline leak and the DEC

involvement took place prior to the current

1 owner taking title to the property in 2013. 2 Obviously, that owner had nothing to 3 do with any of that. 4 By this application, the applicant 5 seeks as a special exception from the Town 6 Board to utilize premises as an auto repair 7 shop in accordance with the plans that have 8 been submitted to the Board. 9 In the event the Board approves this 10 application, the applicant will require 11 variances from the Board of Appeals, as well. 12 The variances that are required by the 13 Board of Appeals is a waiver of off-street 14 parking requirements, permission to park in 15 the front yard setback on Clinton Street, um, 16 a side yard setback variance to maintain 17 addition which are located to the rear of the 18 existing building and a front yard variance 19 to maintain the existing canopy. 20 The plans were submitted to the HTE 21 Design Review Board on July 5th of 2016. 22 That Board found the plans to be 23 incompliance with the applicable criteria,

That Board found the plans to be incompliance with the applicable criteria, so, the Town Board and Board of Appeals process could continue.

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1	The shop has hours of operation from
2	8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday through
3	Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on Saturdays
4	and it is closed on Sunday.
5	There are a total of three employees
6	at the shop.
7	The shop maintains private carting of
8	refuse.
9	I have a copy of a letter that I would
10	like to submit for the record.
11	It is dated February $17^{ m th}$ of 2017 from
12	Eagle Sanitation Incorporated indicating that
13	this entity located in Woodbury providing
14	refuses removal from the property in
15	connection with the use.
16	In addition, I have a letter, also,
17	dated February 17, 2017 from an entity Lorcor
18	Petroleum Services indicating that this
19	entity located in Elizabeth, New Jersey
20	collects waste oil and antifreeze from the
21	premises and the letter states that all such
22	waste oil and antifreeze is processes and
23	recycled with all State and Federal
24	regulations.
25	T would like to submit that letter

1	for the record, as well.
2	Lastly, I have a letter from the New
3	York State Department of Environmental
4	Conservation dated, February 14, 2017.
5	I know the inspection report was
6	issued, references various permits that the
7	Building Department indicates are acquired in
8	connection with the gasoline tanks that were
9	removed from the property.
10	It was the Department of Environmental
11	Conservation that removed those tanks.
12	And, as you see in this letter, it was
13	their position that since it was a State
14	entity that was operating to initiate the
15	cleanup and take whatever action if
16	necessary, it is exempt from the requirement
17	of Town permits for any of that work which
18	would also include removal of tanks which
19	they performed in 2014.
20	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Mr. Avertine,
21	let me understand, the tanks have been
22	removed?
23	The DEC, now, is involved in the
24	remediation?
25	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: That is correct.

1 COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Who is 2 responsible for the remediation? 3 Has that been decided? 4 ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Well, I believe 5 according to the DEC and I spoke to the 6 persons involved with this, they indicated 7 that there is a proceeding against the prior 8 owner that they are trying to follow-up with 9 what happened was apparently when it 10 originally occurred in 2011. 11 They contacted the owner of the 12 premises at that time, who was totally 13 unresponsive to their inquiries. 14 What they did, they stepped in, they 15 took over the entire process, obviously, 16 using the State funds, taxpayer dollars to 17 take care of what needs to be taken care of 18 at the site. 19 At the same time, through the Attorney 20 General's Office, they initiated a regulatory 21 proceedings which, what I have been advised 22 is ongoing, that would be regarding the prior 23 owner, who I would surmise is not in good 24 financial condition since the property was

lost due to the failure to pay real estate

1	taxes and the current owner obtained title to
2	the property by buying the tax lien for the
3	premises.
4	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: So, the
5	applicant, your client, has never operated a
6	gasoline station?
7	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: That is correct.
8	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: It has not sold
9	or distributed any petroleum products?
10	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: No.
11	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Other than what
12	they used to repair
13	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: That is correct,
14	nothing to do with the owner of the property,
15	Foreva Realty, as I indicated, took title in
16	2013.
17	The remediation from the DEC started
18	in 2011 when the tank leak situation was
19	identified.
20	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Is the applicant
21	the owner of the land or the tenant?
22	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: I am sorry?
23	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Is the applicant
24	before us the owner of the land or the
25	tenant?

1	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Both, Foreva
2	Realty and Signature, they are co-applicants
3	in this.
4	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Okay, so, there
5	is an entity that owns the real estate and
6	there is an entity that is going to operate
7	the repair shop?
8	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: That is correct,
9	Mr. Blakeman.
10	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: But you are not
11	going to sell anymore petroleum products at
12	that site?
13	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: We are not selling
14	gasoline, certainly.
15	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Well, yeah
16	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: There is no plan
17	to sell gasoline.
18	They will not they will not be
19	selling auto at retail.
20	You can't go in and buy auto
21	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: They will do oil
22	changes?
23	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Exactly,
24	antifreeze and that type of thing.
25	And, as I indicated, the waste will be

1	removed in accordance with the licensed
2	entity that will come and take care of that.
3	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Thank you.
4	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: My clients are
5	very sensitive to environmental issues,
6	especially, the operator and will operate
7	fully in accordance with all the plans.
8	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Thank you.
9	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Thank you.
10	Unless the Board has any questions at
11	this time, I would like to call Mr. Barry
12	Nelson.
13	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Are there any
14	other Members of the Board that have any
15	questions?
16	COUNCILMAN HUDES: A couple of
17	questions; I notice in the photos you have a
18	number of barrels and drums, are those
19	associated with the DEC or some default of
20	the DEC and some belong to the Town?
21	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: The waste oil from
22	the oil exchange is kept in barrels which are
23	located on the easterly side of the building
24	removed by the company.
25	Um, I explained to the operator that

1	these barrels cannot be kept outside.
2	They have to be kept inside. He was
3	unaware of that and that will be taken care
4	of.
5	COUNCILMAN HUDES: Also, the operator
6	understands unregistered vehicles are a no-
7	no?
8	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Let me explain
9	that to you, the operator has a sister
10	business in, um, right down the road,
11	actually, Franklin Square.
12	It is a used-car facility and that
13	entity purchases unused cars from auctions.
14	Typically, those cars oftentimes
15	require repairs before they can be marketed.
16	What he does, he brings them to his
17	shop. He repairs them and he brings them
18	back to the used car facility to offer them
19	for sale.
20	So, they are not registered because
21	they were purchased from a wholesale market.
22	He does that work for himself.
23	He also does "retail auto repair" for
24	anyone that wants to have their car repaired,
25	fixed or have a State inspection or have an

1	oil change at the shop, but he also does have
2	this faceted business which is the repairs
3	for used-car business.
4	COUNCILMAN HUDES: I think that aspect
5	of it might have to be reviewed by the
6	Building Department, because I know there is
7	a question of unregistered vehicles.
8	I know there are issues with
9	unregistered vehicles on both commercial and
10	private property in the Town of Hempstead
11	having to do with the insurance and so forth
12	and so on.
13	I think that is something we have to
14	look into it.
15	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Commissioner
16	Rottkamp, would you come forward or Mr.
17	Schwartz, either, both.
18	The issue is, essentially,
19	permissibility of unregistered vehicles on
20	commercial property.
21	COMMISSIONER ROTTKAMP: Is there any
22	way of putting Dealer plates on these cars?
23	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Yes.
24	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: No, the question
25	is, it permissible on its face?

1	COMMISSIONER ROTTKAMP: No.
2	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Even if they are
3	awaiting repair?
4	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: No unregistered
5	vehicles?
6	COMMISSIONER ROTTKAMP: No exterior
7	portion.
8	He could seek a special exception with
9	the BZA for the storage of unregistered motor
10	vehicles.
11	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Is it considered
12	storage, Mr. Schwartz, if they are awaiting
13	repair for extending periods of time?
14	MR. SCHWARTZ: Limitations would be
15	twenty-four hours, I don't think these cars
16	will be turned over in twenty-four hours.
17	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: It depends on the
18	nature of the repairs.
19	My client just indicated to me, if it
20	is acceptable to the Board
21	COMMISSIONER ROTTKAMP: It is still
22	unregistered.
23	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: When he purchases
24	them, if he had a Dealer plate, but it has a
25	status as registered, it is under the

1	umbrella of dealership.
2	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Let's finish up.
3	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: As long as it has
4	a plate on it, certainly deemed registered,
5	it is able to be operated on the road and we
6	have all seen this if you go for a test drive
7	on vehicles with new or used
8	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: What we are
9	talking about is the Town Code, Commissioner
10	Rottkamp, is that
11	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: If they keep it
12	inside or go before the BZA
13	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: That is your
14	remedy?
15	COMMISSIONER ROTTKAMP: It is actually
16	considered if they are not road worthy, if
17	they are in disrepair, they are by definition
18	considered to be junked vehicles.
19	If they are that much in disrepair, if
20	they are not road worthy, it doesn't matter
21	if there is a plate on it.
22	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Can I make a
23	suggestion there; maybe the Town Attorney
24	should sit down with all parties and see if
25	this can be worked out.

1 It seems like we are putting this 2 applicant in a Catch-22. 3 Basically, they are operating a 4 business where they buy motor vehicles and 5 some of them need repair and I think in the 6 spirit of the law, the fact that they are not 7 registered but they are in the process of 8 being repaired and sold shouldn't be an 9 impediment of this guy running his business. 10 SUPERVISOR SANTINO: I think the Code 11 is the Code regardless of the spirit. 12 I think if there is a relief relative 13 through the BZA that needs to be pursued, so, 14 what I think we should do, Mr. Avertine, the 15 Town Attorney's Office and the Building 16 Department should meet with you and your 17 client to determine exactly what relief you 18 need so that things are done in accordance 19 with the Code to protect the neighboring 20 residents. 21 ATTORNEY AVERTINE: That would be 22 fine, Mr. Supervisor. 23 As I indicated earlier in my remarks, 24 we have to go to the Board of Appeals for

other relief anyway, so, if there is

1	an additional application that needs to be
2	filed for a special exception regarding the
3	unregistered vehicles
4	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Fine tune it
5	whether you need to make an application.
6	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Absolutely,
7	Supervisor, we will do that.
8	It is clearly we don't want to go
9	through the necessary process and find out we
10	need something else we need.
11	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Commissioner
12	Rottkamp, I will leave that up to you to set
13	that meeting up.
14	COMMISSIONER ROTTKAMP: Absolutely,
15	sir.
16	COUNCILMAN HUDES: You have that area
17	on the corner which seems to be a pretty much
18	about the only area that there is to beautify
19	this property, where your sign is.
20	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Yes.
21	COUNCILMAN HUDES: The very corner
22	where there is a lump of concrete, a block of
23	concrete, chips, stones, the asphalt is in
24	all disrepair, I didn't see any landscaped
25	plans, so, I am assuming that corner could

1	be expanded to that "V" on the corner, at
2	least, it doesn't look like much room there
3	that could be improved on that property.
4	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: We can have
5	something designed for submission, um, to the
6	Town Board regarding the landscaping.
7	As you can see, um, there is not
8	really a lot of area on site for landscaping
9	at all.
10	This is a site that was developed in
11	1961 when things were a little bit different
12	than they were, today.
13	So, I will speak to my client and
14	formulate something and submit it for the
15	Board to review.
16	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Okay, any other
17	questions from Members of the Board?
18	(Whereupon, no response was heard.
19	After, the following ensued.)
20	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Okay, Mr.
21	Avertine, you may proceed.
22	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Mr. Nelson,
23	please, offer your name and address for the
24	record.
25	BARRY NELSON: Good Morning, Barry

1	Nelson. 220 Petit Avenue, Bellmore, New York
2	11710.
3	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Good Morning, Mr.
4	Nelson.
5	BARRY NELSON: Good Morning, thank
6	you.
7	I handed a packet of photographs. The
8	Board has their own.
9	They were taken by myself on February
10	6, 2017.
11	I am also handing 29 photographs,
12	inclusive of the Nassau County Land and Tax
13	Map of the subject property.
14	I am going to hand in I am handing
15	in, um, the original Nassau County Department
16	of Assessment Tax Records for the subject
17	parcel.
18	The subject parcel is on the northeast
19	corner of Hempstead Turnpike and Clinton
20	Street, Section 33, Block 368, that includes
21	tax Lots 20 through 24.
22	It is a corner parcel.
23	It was originally developed in 1960,
24	early 1960's with a service station, gasoline
25	and service.

1	The building is just under fifteen
2	hundred square feet.
3	The site is, approximately, eight
4	thousand eight hundred and three square feet.
5	It is a corner parcel.
6	Hempstead Turnpike is the main
7	arterial road, East and West traffic lights.
8	At the corner of Remsen Street, just
9	to the West and Grand Street to the East.
10	There is no permitted parking on the
11	North side of Hempstead Turnpike at this
12	location.
13	Two ways East and West.
14	The site is entirely within the HTE-HB
15	Overlay District.
16	What is before the Board is for a
17	special exception for the auto repairs at
18	that location.
19	The building has been there since
20	1961, a two-bay service station.
21	The uses found in the immediate
22	vicinity, as I indicated, the subject
23	property is entirely within that HTE-HB
24	Overlay Business X Zone.
25	The property entirely in that zone

has Residential C zoning to the North, onefamily houses on Clinton Street, Remsen Street, Grand Avenue, Cape Cod built in the 1940's and the 1950's. Hempstead Turnpike has uses that are

Hempstead Turnpike has uses that are compatible to the auto repair just to the East, outside the three hundred, two hundred and three hundred foot zone, we have auto repair, I mean, auto zone, auto parts and auto repair facility.

Avis Lube at the northeast corner of Grand Avenue and Hempstead Turnpike.

Mixed uses, apartments over retail in the subject block, just mid East to the subject parcel is auto related use, auto sound and window tinting.

I am not sure how long window tinting is going to last at that location with the changing of the current laws.

To the West is a soda beverage,

opposite the subject property and multi
family dwelling, more units at the northeast

corner of Remsen Street and Hempstead

Turnpike.

Those uses would be similar to the

1 South side of Hempstead Turnpike; auto parts, 2 auto sales, used cars, um, auto repairs, auto 3 collision and taxi depot. 4 At the southeast corner of Evans 5 Avenue and Hempstead Turnpike, this use that 6 is being looked to maintain on the subject 7 property as a special exception, has been 8 approved previously at the site with 9 gasoline. 10 The gasoline will be removed. 11 The site, now, has a remediation on 12 the property at the westerly side, along the 13 East side of Clinton Street and that area is 14 approximately thirty by forty, enclosed with 15 fencing and there are some trailers and 16 remediation equipment on the site. 17 The use is commonly found along 18 Hempstead Turnpike. 19 It has been, at this location, for 20 over fifty-five years. 21 It was formerly approved. 22 The gasoline has been removed and I 23 believe it is a reasonable request 24 considering the overall side of the property

of about eight thousand eight hundred

1	square feet.
2	The other permitted uses that may lend
3	itself for a development at that location
4	would require substantially demolition of the
5	existing improvement at the site at a
6	substantial cost.
7	Nevertheless, typically at corner
8	locations, you would find 7-ELEVEN's or
9	Dunkin Donuts type facilities which you have
10	in the area.
11	The site, now, currently has real
12	estate taxes of, approximately, thirty-one
13	thousand five hundred dollars which, um,
14	would probably go away in a redevelopment
15	that is, approximately, twenty dollars a
16	square foot.
17	And, I believe, it is substantial for
18	the area.
19	Nevertheless, it is typical for auto
20	repair facilities.
21	You have auto collision which has no
22	intention of operating an auto collision shop
23	at that location.
24	You have auto repairs and auto parts.
25	The residences were built in the

1	spot at the same time, maybe earlier on
2	Clinton Street.
3	I looked at home sales in the area,
4	generally.
5	They are between three hundred and
6	four hundred and fifty thousand dollars.
7	There is a residence to the North, has
8	been there for many, many years adjacent to
9	the repair shop, the auto gas station.
10	The applicant did put a new fence
11	along the northerly property line.
12	I believe this case comes before this
13	Board for a special exception meets the
14	criteria for a special exception and it is a
15	reasonable request before this Board.
16	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Are there any
17	questions for Mr. Nelson?
18	(Whereupon, no response was heard.
19	After, the following ensued.)
20	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Thank you, Mr.
21	Nelson.
22	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: In summation, Mr.
23	Supervisors, most of the issued listed in the
24	Inspection Report will be addressed as we go
25	through the rest of the process and

1	housekeeping issues that we were made aware
2	of as a result of the inspection are already
3	remedied or will be remedied shortly.
4	As far as issues regarding filing
5	permits, etc., we did file for a lot of these
6	permits already.
7	Of course, as the Board is aware, the
8	Board of Appeals would not process the
9	variance applications unless and until such
10	time as this Board considers the application
11	for special exception, so, we respectfully
12	request, that after deliberation, the Board
13	approve the application for the repair shop.
14	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Thank you.
15	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Thank you.
16	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Mr. Robert Diaz?
17	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: He is the
18	Operator.
19	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Okay, that is
20	fine.
21	I believe we only have one resident
22	that signed in.
23	Thank you very much, Mr. Avertine, you
24	can stand down. Thank you, Mr. Nelson.
25	BARRY NELSON: Thank you.

1	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Maryanne
2	Curiello. (phonetic spelling)
3	Please, have a seat.
4	MARYANNE CURIELLO: I just
5	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Name and address
6	for the record.
7	MARYANNE CURIELLO: Okay, Maryanne
8	Curiello. (phonetic spelling). 11 Grand
9	Street, not Avenue.
10	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Elmont, got it.
11	Can you pull the microphone closer to
12	you.
13	MARYANNE CURIELLO: Okay, it was
14	difficult to hear in the back.
15	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Better, now.
16	MARYANNE CURIELLO: I have a number of
17	concerns, one, about the cars that don't have
18	license plates that are around, from time to
19	time, less more than before
20	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Yes.
21	MARYANNE CURIELLO: On the
22	street.
23	I am also concerned about something
24	that is already been mentioned and that is
25	the way the property looks which is fairly

1	horrible, even though it is on Hempstead
2	Turnpike, it doesn't mean that it has to be
3	ugly.
4	The snow has to be shoveled and things
5	like that.
6	So, as a resident in the area, I am
7	concerned about what things are going to look
8	like.
9	I am also concerned and maybe I am
10	incorrect but I understood that the gas tanks
11	needed to be removed.
12	The gas, I guess, it has been removed
13	but the tanks, itself, haven't been, maybe I
14	am wrong in that but I don't think so.
15	Um, so that is a concern and I know
16	that people who want to use the property, I
17	don't think are the owners of the property,
18	so, they are renting from someone else but,
19	um, there is an issue with the DEC
20	eventually, the plume has to be dug up from
21	Hempstead Turnpike down to Honeywell Avenue.
22	So, there seems to be a lot of work
23	that is required on that property and to make
24	it safe for the neighborhood and that's it.
25	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Thank you, Ms.

1	Cariello.
2	I appreciate your remarks.
3	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Mr. Avertine,
4	you indicated that the tanks have been
5	removed, correct?
6	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: I can't verify it,
7	personally, but the DEC stated that they were
8	removed in 2014.
9	They retained a contract for that
10	purpose and that the tanks were, indeed,
11	removed.
12	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: The
13	environmental issue is being addressed?
14	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Absolutely, what
15	is going on presently is that, actually,
16	since DEC became involved, um, there was, a,
17	um, there was soil was removed at the
18	same time that the tanks were removed.
19	There was extensive soil removal and
20	remediation, um, and presently what they are
21	doing is they did two types of remediation,
22	one was with respect to the soil, one was
23	with respect to groundwater.
24	And, with respect to the groundwater,
25	they did whatever process that they

1	have done and, now, they are in the process
2	of monitoring the groundwater taking samples
3	and taking it to determine whether the
4	measures that they have taken to date have
5	been sufficient to
6	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: They put
7	groundwater monitoring wells in?
8	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Yes.
9	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: And, they are
10	continuing to monitor it and there is no more
11	petroleum sales other than like you said, the
12	oil change, there is no gasoline being sold,
13	no more gasoline being put into tanks?
14	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Right, that is
15	correct and the tanks have been removed, at
16	least, according to DEC.
17	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Do you have
18	written notification, Mr. Avertine from the
19	DEC?
20	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: They have prepared
21	a document called a "Fact Sheet" regarding
22	this premises.
23	It is attached to the Environmental
24	Assessment Form that I have filed with the
25	application.

1	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: That is from the
2	DEC?
3	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: It is from the
4	DEC.
5	It is from a, um, Christie Salafria,
6	S-A-L-A (Phonetic spelling)
7	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: If you can maybe
8	point out the pertinent lines relative to the
9	tanks to Ms. Curiello.
10	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: I can give you a
11	copy of the document.
12	MARYANNE CURIELLO: Of course, they
13	are continuing to work on them.
14	They have been working on it for
15	years, what I read online, it would continue
16	for quite a while.
17	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: It is a lengthy
18	process.
19	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: Mr. Supervisor, I
20	also would be happy to introduce the neighbor
21	to my client, so, if she has a question or a
22	concern or a problem, he is very, very
23	receptive to the neighbors and very
24	interested in what they have to say and wants
25	to run a shop that everyone

1	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: He wants to be a
2	good neighbor.
3	MARYANNE CURIELLO: That is all we
4	want.
5	ATTORNEY AVERTINE: I will introduce
6	them at the conclusion of the Hearing.
7	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Thank you.
8	Is there anyone else in the audience
9	that wants to speak on this matter before the
10	Town Board?
11	(Whereupon, no response was heard.
12	After, the following ensued.)
13	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: There being none,
14	I will accept a Motion.
15	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Mr. Supervisor,
16	I move that the Public Hearing be closed and
17	the Board reserve decision.
18	COUNCILMAN D'ESPOSITO: I second the
19	Motion.
20	CLERK AHMAD: Supervisor Santino?
21	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Aye.
22	CLERK AHMAD: Councilman Blakeman?
23	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Aye.

6	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: On the Decision
7	Calendar.
8	CLERK AHMAD: On the Decision
9	Calendar, Supervisor, I have two items,

25	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Mr. Town Attorney

1	would you address that, please.
2	TOWN ATTORNEY RA: The personnel
3	calendar was published online.
4	Is Mr. Bill Sammon, here?
5	SUPERVISOR SAMMON: Mr. Sammon, would
6	you come forward.
7	PERSONNEL DIRECTOR SAMMON: Mr.
8	Supervisor, Members of the Town Board:
9	It is going to be on today's social
10	calendar.
11	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Thank you.
12	DIANE MADDEN: Thank you.
13	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Are there any
