25	In 1984 this Board approved the	

1	premises for a Midas Muffler Shop.	
2	Attached to the petition that we	
3	submitted and in support of this application	
4	was a Declaration of Restrictive Covenants	Page 25
5	which was placed on by the owner of the	
6	property at the time and the owners of the	
7	Midas Muffler Shop.	
8	The conditions at the time indicated	
9	that the Midas Muffler Shop would be	
10	developed subject to certain restrictions	
11	which were numbered one through 19.	
12	Unfortunately, these restrictions	
13	would not allow us to operate Mavis Tire Shop	
14	at this location.	
15	And, in particular, Number 1,	
16	Restriction 1 states the above property would	
17	be developed only with a standard Midas	
18	Muffler Shop with only underlined	
19	substantially in accordance with the attached	
20	site plan by Cushman Architects dated	
21	November 18, 1983 and further revised on	
22	March 15, 1984.	
23	We are requesting that restriction be	
24	stricken.	
25	Um, the Midas Muffler Shop is not	

1	continuing at this location and the reason my	
2	client executed with the owner is subject	
3	to the approval of this Board striking	
4	these restrictions that we are requesting.	Page 26
5	Um, the Midas Muffler Shop is a	
6	muffler shop that does auto repair.	
7	Mavis is a tire and auto shop and does	
8	similar work.	
9	We are going to be operating in the	
10	same building, so	
11	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: We didn't hear	
12	you, what restrictions are you looking to	
13	waive?	
14	ATTORNEY EDWARDS: Restriction Number	
15	1.	
16	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Which is?	
17	ATTORNEY EDWARDS: Basically, you can	
18	only operate the property, the owner can	
19	only operate as a Midas Muffler Shop.	
20	We are putting a similar use in.	
21	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Okay.	
22	ATTORNEY EDWARDS: But it is going to	
23	be a Mavis.	
24	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: That is the only	
25	restriction?	

1	ATTORNEY EDWARDS: No, we have a	
2	couple more.	
3	Restriction Number 2, that we are	
4	asking for relief.	Page 27
5	We have hours on Sunday. We are	
6	requesting Sunday hours, as well, because	
7	Mavis is a seven day a week operation.	
8	Midas always closed on Sunday, all of	
9	their locations closed on Sunday.	
10	So, we are asking, as I indicated and	
11	submitted, the hours of operation of Mavis	
12	elven out of twelve operators' operations	
13	in Nassau County in the Town of Hempstead	
14	have Sunday hours, that is important to the	
15	community.	
16	Back in 1984, I guess, Sunday wasn't	
17	an important retail day, but it is an	
18	important retail day, now.	
19	People have to get their car repaired,	
20	tires repaired.	
21	They wait around and do the service.	
22	And, um, we also have a large Jewish	
23	population in West Hempstead and who need	
24	service and things have changed since 1984.	
25	The service stations that were there	

1	when we grew up, they use to provide service	
2	to us, they are basically disappearing.	
3	They are becoming few pumpers. Now,	
4	you get your service either from	Page 28
5	dealerships, places like Mavis or PEP Boys	
6	or there a few service stations around the	
7	service for the community, as well.	
8	And, there is a third application, we	
9	are making changes to the building,	
10	basically, when the Town put restrictions	
11	only, typically, Mavis Shop, obviously,	
12	Mavis has different colors, different	
13	operation.	
14	The building is staying the same. We

2	ATTORNEY EDWARDS: Mavis is going to	
3	come in there, rip it all out, put new	
4	fencing on the exterior line, put all new	Page 30
5	fences in the boxes that were designated on	
6	the site plan and also clean up the place	
7	and live by the rules and regulations and	
8	restrictions and covenants.	
9	So, I went and viewed the property	
10	last week and it isn't pretty.	
11	And, we are going to make it pretty.	
12	If you look at the Mavis Shops in your	
13	own Council Districts, they are very well	
14	maintained.	
15	COUNCILMAN AMBROSINO: I am saying,	
16	Supervisor, I, respectfully would say,	
17	subject to that, that the Commissioner	
18	would have to sign off on it, restrictions	
19	and violations would be remediated and	
20	changed	
21	ATTORNEY EDWARDS: We are going to rip	
22	the whole place apart.

2	It has never been opened on Sundays.	
3	ATTORNEY EDWARDS: We sent a letter	
4	regarding this, notices to each in the	Page 34
5	radius and we found the response is on the	
6	opposite corner on the same side, there is	
7	another tire and gas place, that is opened	
8	up on Sundays on the behind it is a	
9	house, that has got more of a commercial	
10	garage.	
11	We haven't heard anything from the	
12	residents.	
13	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Okay, we will	
14	give you an opportunity to speak at the	
15	end, if you wish.

5	today, wrote a letter and took a picture of	
6	what Midas' fence looks like that you guys	
7	have all been talking about is in terrible	
8	disrepair.	
9	And, I thought one of the Covenants	
10	when they originally made Midas was that	
11	they weren't going to park any cars in that	
12	lot in the back overnight.	
13	And, that has never been the case.	
14	There has always been commercial cars	
15	parked there and as the fellow mentioned,	
16	the house next to it, we never complained	
17	but the house next to it is a rental and
