18	Royce Winnick?	
19	Good Morning, how are you?	
20	Name and address for the record.	
21	ROYCE WINNICK: My name is Royce	
22	Winnick.	
23	I live at 2758 Lincoln Boulevard,	
24	Merrick.	
25	I am in support of the Park.	

1	I have been in support of the Park for	
2	the last two years since we have been trying	
3	to get it.	
4	I am here, today, to read some letters	Page 73
5	from a resident that could not be here.	
6	"Dear Supervisor Santino, I am writing	
7	this letter to be submitted at the Town Hall	
8	Meeting scheduled for 10:30.	
9	"I am unfortunately unable to	
10	participate given my work commitments and	
11	want to ensure my support for the Wynsum Park	
12	playground.	
13	"It was recorded for full	
14	consideration.	
15	"I, now, have been a Member of this	
16	community for five years.	
17	"I have two children ages seven and	
18	four and live within walking distance to the	
19	green space for the intended Park.	
20	"A Park would be a wonderful addition	
21	for the community, as it would provide a	
22	great place for the Merrick community and our	
23	immediate neighbors to come together,	
24	interact allowing for adults to network and	
25	children to begin to build long-lasting	

1	Friendships.

13	with best intentions surveyed the

20	steps were taken to build at the Wynsum

5	Do you want to give them to the Clerk	
6	to make them part of the record.	
7	Paul Goodman?	
8	Name and address for the record, sir?	
9	PAUL GOODMAN: Paul Goodman. 3016	
10	Wynsum Avenue, directly sharing the gates	
11	with the Wynsum Avenue parking lot.	
12	So, I guess it is fair to say, I am	
13	not for the Park.	
14	We had a meeting not too long ago, it	
15	was a South Civic, South Merrick neighborhood	
16	volunteer meeting where the items were	
17	discussed and I took an approach at that	
18	meeting, not trying to convince others that	
19	they should be for the Park or against the	
20	Park because it is pretty clear that you have	
21	a lot of people that are coming to coming	
22	up, here and ae for the Park.	
23	And, regardless of where they live or

8	large pile of letters that are "against" the	
9	Park.	
10	So, getting passed that, I never	
11	realized before that, the thought, the	
12	feeling that the parents of South Merrick	
13	were so, you know, feeling so, I guess,	
14	jipped by not having a Park in walking	
15	distance.	
16	There are plenty of Parks in our	
17	neighborhood.	
18	There are Parks as what we referred to	
19	as the other Peninsula that you will hear	
20	from.	
21	There is a large, beautiful Park down	
22	by Newbridge Road.	
23	There is a Park by a school.	
24	There is a Park called Julian Lane.	
25	There are plenty of Parks.	

1	On top of that, we have backyards	1
2	where many of us have swing sets.	
3	Again, I never realized until today,	
4	how the parents, children of the South	Page 81
5	Merrick community are missing anything in	
6	life without having a particular Park that	
7	they consider they can walk to.	
8	But, this is America, people can fight	
9	for things that they want, so be it.	
10	One of the things that we mentioned in	
11	the South Civic Meeting was that we were	
12	going to have an amicable collection of minds	
13	that would come together and say what can we	
14	do to get on the same page.	
15	And, yes, of course, those of us that	
16	are surrounded by the Park, sharing a fence	
17	with the Park, yes, we are probably the	
18	loudest voices that are against the Park.	
19	We will be affected by the Park.	
20	What will the affects be?

25	Will the parking exceed what the	

1	limits on parking are?	
2	Will people continue to speed as	
3	children are crossing the street?	
4	A lot of people brought up Stop signs.	Page 82
5	I personally can tell you, I could	
6	care less about Stop signs. Everybody in	
7	South Merrick pretty much rolls up anyway.	
8	They don't come up to much of a stop.	
9	It is really the fear of the unknown.	
10	What to do about noise?	
11	Is the parking going to be maintained?	
12	Things of that nature.	
13	So, what we decided to do, we decided	
14	to we agreed with, you know, those that	
15	are head of the Park, we would take some	
16	time.	
17	We would get together and come to an	
18	amicable solution.	
19	Can we agree to do something together	
20	and I believe that we left that meeting	
21	shaking hands and saying that we can do that.	
22	Now, we fast forward to, now and	
23	whatever the correct term is, the item has	
24	been put on to the calendar, so, we are,	
25	here, talking about it, today.	

1	But, we have missed the opportunity to

1	However, I will also note with Mr.	
2	Goodman, that he and I did attend that	
3	meeting this past weekend, in an attempt to	
4	try to litigate some of our concerns.	Page 85
5	I do also feel that there can be and	
6	should be further attempts to do that but,	
7	let me run through the concerns that I have.	
8	As I said, I live directly across the	
9	street from this Park.

11	children are at an age where it is

9	There is a playground development at	
10	the Newbridge Road Park.	
11	There is a playground development at	
12	the Birch School.	
13	All of these playground developments	
14	lie situated within one and a half to 1.8	
15	miles of this Wynsum Avenue field.	
16	There are plenty of options.	
17	These areas are close. They are even	
18	close enough where my son will soon be twelve	
19	where we actually use to ride our bikes at	
20	the Julian Lane Park.	
21	In addition, there is, from my	
22	understanding and I don't stand here to say	
23	even for a heartbeat that we as those who	
24	live directly surrounding the Park deserve	
25	some sort of super majority or super veto	

1	or anything of that nature, it is also my	
2	understanding that historically speaking,	
3	that the Town of Hempstead has not approved	
4	any similar park development where the	Page 88
5	individuals who are most impacted, directly	
6	impacted being the people who immediately	
7	surround the Park are all those even if	
8	there had been one or two individuals that	
9	immediately surround the Park were in favor,	
10	that is still not an accurate reflection.	
11	This is the vast of all the	
12	individuals that immediately surround the	
13	Park or both.	
14	There are others who oppose, that live	
15	further out.	
16	There are others that support this	
17	that live further out.	
18	Time is not of the essence in this	
19	case.	
20	We have been told and I know Mr.	
21	Goodman took the opportunity to meet at	
22	Councilwoman King-Sweeney's house this	
23	evening weekend of the leaders of the	
24	proposition to ask why it had to be done so	
25	quiably was there a hard and wast deadline	

1	to this funding in the IMA.	
2	The answer is simply no.	
3	This is a political-base assumption on	
4	the part of the proponents.	Page 89
5	I am running out of time. I have ten	
6	seconds.	
7	I ask for the courtesy of a few	
8	seconds more.	
9	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Just a few.	
10	AARON GOLDSMITH: Most importantly, I	
11	also happen to feel I will wait for the	
12	buzzer.	
13	(Whereupon, the five-minute bell rang.	
14	After, the following ensued.)	
15	AARON GOLDSMITH: The Park is zoned	
16	duly as a Park but it is also zoned as a	
17	wildlife conservation, which, I believe,	
18	presents a more significant hurdle than	
19	people are willing to give credit for and I	
20	do have copies for every one of the local	
21	zoning to make part of the record.	
22	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Thank you very	
23	much.	
24	AARON GOLDSMITH: There is another	
25	option that does satisfy the concerns of	

1	Public Safety for the local residents.	
2	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Can you, please,	
3	rap up.	
4	AARON GOLDSMITH: Supervisor, there is	Page 90
5	a similar filed three blocks away on a far	
6	less populated street, far less traveled with	
7	one point of ingress and egress and	
8	presumably pose far less of a threat for	
9	children entering and exiting into traffic.	
10	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Thank you.	
11	AARON GOLDSMITH: And, I do hope	
12	whatever happens beyond, today, the parties	
13	as neighbors can try to go forward.	
14	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Thank you.	
15	(Whereupon, applause from the audience	
16	was heard. After, the following ensued.)	
17	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Kathryn Stone?	
18	Kathryn Stone?	
19	KATHRYN STONE: Hi, my name is Kathryn	
20	Stone. 2087 Birchwood Lane, Merrick, New	
21	York.	
22	I am here, today, as a resident of	
23	Merrick to not only put on the record the	
24	undeniable support for Wynsum Avenue	
25	Playground Project but to ask the question	

1	why?	
2	Why are we having doubts that we are	
3	all here to vote on today is not going to be	
4	unanimous, in favor.	Page 91
5	Why do I question, you, Mr. Santino on	
6	your ability to follow through with your	
7	request for funding for this project?	
8	The only way that this project was	
9	able to secure funding from Nassau County was	
10	with your written request.	
11	So, why?	
12	Why am I skeptical that you will not	
13	be voting in favor for something that you	
14	asked for?	
15	We began the project with a single	
16	petition reaching out to the residents in our

23	voices of those closest to the proposed area.	
24	The Town chose the homes that you felt

24	Before any thought to move forward on	
25	this, the thirty homeowners on the perimeter	

1	of this field need to be heard and	I
2	considered.	
3	I have spoken to many homeowners in	
4	the adjoining area to the Park and most	Page 99
5	display strong opposition, mostly because of	
6	the added activity it would create.	
7	We are directly affected by this, by	
8	our property values and the right to quiet	
9	enjoyment and safety.	
10	The Park is currently used for various	
11	activities.	
12	Little League has practices there,	
13	families gather, elderly people relax on the	
14	benches, just to name a few.	
15	It is not as if the space is dormant	
16	as many have said.	
17	It is currently used by the residents	
18	of Merrick.	
19	Action group, Let's Play, 11566 has	
20	had a petition signed by most residents that	
21	don't live anywhere near this Park, some of	
22	them are from other Towns.	
23	The zip code, "11566," encompasses	
24	many miles.	
25	Anyone would sign a petition to have	

1	a playground for their young children not	
2	really considering all the risks involved.	
3	I don't blame them on this.	
4	All these people are considering is	Page 100
5	that they have another Park to choose from in	
6	the area.	
7	A full safety study of the area must	
8	be done by the Town of Hempstead and not rely	
9	on a letter from a local police precinct	
10	stating that no crime or accidents have yet	
11	to take place.	
12	In fact, I had an accident on that	
13	corner of the Park this past Summer and I did	
14	not report it to the police.	
15	There are playgrounds and swings,	
16	monkey bars at Birch, Chatterton, Bebe,	
17	Lakeside and Julian Lake Park.	
18	All are centrally located for Merrick	
19	families that live near these areas.	
20	There are also other Parks on	
21	Clubhouse Road and Elliot Drive.	
22	The community does not have any	
23	shortage of play areas.	
24	I am disappointed by our elected	
25	officials that have jumped on board in favor	

1	of this proposal without first considering	
2	the safety issues and the homeowners who are	
3	directly affected.	
4	Thank you very much.	Page 101
5	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Thank you.	
6	(Whereupon, applause from the audience	
7	was heard. After, the following ensued.)	
8	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Mr. Anthony	
9	Capetola, Anthony Capetola?	
10	Good Afternoon, name and address for	
11	the record.	
12	ATTORNEY CAPETOLA: Anthony Capetola.	
13	2-C Hillside Avenue, Williston Park, New	
14	York.	
15	Sitting behind me is sitting next	
16	to me, excuse me, is Stephanie Ovadio.	
17	(Phonetic spelling)	
18	We are both Attorneys. We represent,	
19	um, several of the, um, people affected by	
20	the Park issue, specifically, the	
21	Matcotullios that live at 3031 Wynsum Avenue,	
22	Clare and Eric Kasdorf that live at 3037	
23	Wynsum.	
24	These are directly across from the	
25	Wynsum Avenue and entrance of the Park.	

1	We also represent Patty Emerson that	
2	lives on the other side.	
3	We are vehemently opposed on behalf of	
4	these three families to the Park being	Page 102
5	approved by the Board.	
6	We feel after listening to the	
7	presentation by many of the citizens, I	
8	don't' want to rehash things that have been

10	this area.	
11	Parking in the area without relying on	
12	their driveways and other areas that ingress	
13	and egress to permit parking and this will	
14	create a parking hazard.

8	I just worked on a Park for about two	
9	years in Point Lookout.	
10	It is beautifully maintained.	
11	ATTORNEY OVADIO: I am sure it is.	
12	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: let's her from	
13	the Counsel, go ahead.	
14	ATTORNEY OVADIO: I would like to show	
15	you, at least, photos, the Parks current	
16	state.	
17	It is, first of all, the first photo I	
18	would like to show you, shows the fence in	
19	its current condition.	
20	You can notice that this fence is	
21	lifted up.

16	And, I can only tell you I am not a	
17	lawyer. I am not a policeman.	
18	I am not a politician but I am smart	
19	enough to know that in our days, the police	
20	answer 911 calls and that is about it because	
21	they are on the hook if they get out of the	
22	car and try to do anything else.

14	serve as a great place to meet and socialize

16	"Currently we do not have any children	
17	play areas on the Wynsum area Peninsula.	
18	"And, walking nearly two miles with my	
19	seven and two years old on another peninsula	
20	is not feasible.	
21	"The proposal that I have seen is for	
22	a simple playground that people in the area	
23	can walk to, just like the opportunity	
24	afforded to living those living on the	

other peninsula.

1	"I thank you for your time and	
2	tremendous service to the Town of Hempstead."	
3	And, one more, I will share.

6	"Supervisor Santino: I am in support	
7	of the Park at Wynsum and Iona.	
8	"You approved this.	
9	"You supported this.	
10	"Why the change of heart?	
11	"You surveyed the community a year ago	
12	and two to one people were in favor of this	
13	Park.	
14	"Two to one in support.	
15	"You represent the entire community,	
16	not a dozen homes.	
17	"This Park belongs to the entire	
18	community, not just a few homes.	
19	"A few people are trying to dictate	
20	what is appropriate for the entire community.	
21	"How is that fair?	
22	"In May you wrote the Civic	
23	Association to tell them that you were in

2	SHARON FIELD: I have been living at	
3	that address for thirty-four years.	
4	I am the second house on the corner	Page 132
5	and, um, I raised my two children there from	
6	the age of four and sixteen months.	
7	There are a few things. I don't have	
8	anything prepared figuratively and I am old	
9	school.	
10	It is all coming from here.	
11	(Indicating)	
12	Having lived here and raised my	
13	children here, who, in turn, purchased their	
14	own homes and are, now, raising their own	
15	children here, I have lived in the area of	
16	this parcel of land that should become a	
17	Park.

9	Let me reiterate, that is the only

13	There are so many issues facing our	
14	community.	
15	There is the drug issue, which I hear

18	Many of the people who complain about	
19	the drug paraphernalia in the Parks are	
20	sitting, here, today, hypocrites want another	
21	Park.	
22	I hear concerns about locking your	
23	cars because there are kinds of crime in the	
24	area and people getting their cars broken	
25	into.	

1	And, I also hear about, "Oh, my God, they	
2	put 7-ELEVEN across the street from our	
3	children's school, what is that going to	
4	bring in?"	Page 154
5	And, you know what, they were right.	
6	There was a robbery. I have no	
7	problem with it, by the way.	
8	There are some really big problems,	
9	here and what is the rush and I really	
10	strongly feel that it is on all of you our	
11	elected officials to really consider what you	
12	are doing before you rush to push this budget	
13	along.	
14	Thank you.	
15	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Thank you, Ms.	
16	Goldsmith.	
17	(Whereupon, applause from the audience	
18	was heard. After, the following ensued.)	
19	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Diane Madden.	
20	DIANE MADDEN: Diane Madden,	
21	Hempstead.	
22	Um, my ears went up when I heard Mr.	
23	Muller was going door-to-door.	
24	Can someone, please, explain to me in	
25	a little more detail if Mr. Muller was going	

1	door-to-door if he visited the homes of	
2	people that support this Park?	
3	Um, you know, I am very concerned	
4	aside from this issue that Mr. Muller	Page 155
5	introduces himself as your personal Attorney,	
6	Mr. Santino?	
7	So, I just want to have a better idea	
8	of his participation in this issue.	
9	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Mr. Town	
10	Attorney, would you address that, please.	
11	TOWN ATTORNEY RA: I think that	
12	anything that Mr. Muller did is in context of	
13	him as an Attorney.	
14	And, I will not comment on that.	
15	If there was a record of who went out,	
16	if you like to FOIL that, if there is a	
17	record, we will make it available to you.	
18	DIANE MADDEN: You're suggesting that	
19	the people were not interviewed or they	
20	didn't receive a visit from Mr. Muller to	
21	FOIL to find out who did	
22	TOWN ATTORNEY RA: I don't have first-	
23	hand knowledge of this but, I think, we	
24	accommodated everybody with our outreach	
25	through a mailing and ringing doorbells, I	

1	think.	
2	COUNCILWOMAN KING-SWEENEY: Actually,	
3	Mr. Ra, I think you are totally right that we	
4	reached everyone when folks from, Let's Play	Page 156
5	came to my office and right away, um, I said,	
6	okay, I am not from South Merrick.	
7	I am not from Merrick.	
8	So, I don't know the community as well	
9	as these people do.	
10	Let's bring in the Parks Commissioner	
11	to sit down and find out what the ideas are,	
12	what the Town of Hempstead process is and I	
13	had just finished I was actually involved	
14	the Point Lookout Park Project, so, I was	
15	somewhat familiar with the process.	
16	So, the Parks Commissioner, we had a	
17	map, Shawn and Jay came with, um, a bunch of	
18	signatures and showed support for the Park.	
19	And, there was a lot of people	
20	supporting it and, I believe just let me	
21	speak to, I believe it was the Parks	
22	Commissioner, he said that was okay.	
23	You have all of those letters in	
24	support, but we can't accept that.	
25	We have to do our own survey and we	

1	did our own survey.	
2	It was asked and answered and it was	
3	two to one in favor.	
4	This isn't my Park.	Page 157
5	This isn't my neighborhood.	
6	It is not Wantagh or Wantagh Woods	
7	where I have a real feel for it, but, we did	
8	the survey and it was two to one in favor.	
9	And, now, Mr. Muller, the last couple	
10	of days has selectively gone to homes.	
11	I know one home for sure was not	
12	visited, um, because she has been a vocal	
13	advocate for the Park and I know Mr. Muller	
14	was telling people who were opposed to the	
15	Park to bring out the Cavalry.	
16	And, I am not sure that is the role of	
17	a Town Lawyer to be an advocate one way or	
18	the other for a Park.	
19	DIANE MADDEN: I couldn't agree more.	
20	I mean this whole thing stinks to me	
21	for a number of reasons and, um, who says no	
22	to children?	
23	I mean, this is not I understand	
24	maybe a few people in the area might be	
25	spoiled and used as property for their own	

1	purposes but if this can be used for	
2	children, who says no?	
3	What are you going to do with all	
4	these children if this is an issue that is	Page 158
5	going on for over a year?	
6	Are you going to take a photo op,	
7	Supervisor Santino with all the children you	
8	say not to that and are looking forward to a	
9	Park?	
10	(Whereupon, "What is the purpose of	
11	this speech, at this point," was heard	
12	yelling out from the audience. Whereupon,	
13	"let her speak," was heard yelling from the	
14	audience. After, the following ensued.)	
15	DIANE MADDEN: Have a nice day. That	
16	give you an example.	
17	(Whereupon, "You don't live in the	
18	area," was heard yelling out from the	
19	audience.)	
20	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: The audience on	
21	both sides, let's maintain good order.	
22	Let's maintain good order in the	
23	audience and continue your remarks.	
24	DIANE MADDEN: Like I said, for a	
25	number of reasons, I think there are many	

1	concerns about this issue.	
2	I don't have to live across the street	
3	to have an opinion and I do have an opinion.	
4	I think that this should be tabled and	Page 159
5	there should be more feedback from both sides	
6	and those numbers that Councilwoman Sweeney	
7	just mentioned would be concerning to me that	
8	more people are in support than against it.	
9	And, um, we are always talking about

2	nighttime.	
3	Brings more of the activity that you	
4	don't really want.	Page 160
5	Also, that is all I wanted to say.	
6	Thank you for your time.	
7	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Thank you, sir.	
8	(Whereupon, applause from the audience	
9	was heard. After, the following ensued.)	
10	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Howard Tuchman?	
11	HOWARD TUCHMAN: Yeah, I am coming.	
12	So, this is a picture of what they are	
13	proposing to build.	
14	They wanted me to show you.

25	very excited to watch my local government	

1	in action.	
2	Something told me to be here in person	
3	to watch this resolution pass and more than	
4	one and a half years, not being rushed, of	161
5	collecting signatures, approvals and of	
6	course, thousands of dollars.	
7	Much easier to get a signature than to	
8	actually collect money from people.	
9	I would have loved to bring my six	
10	year old and two years old, today, but, of	
11	course, they are in school.	
12	They are super excited to at the	
13	prospect of having a Park that they can walk	
14	to.	
15	I wanted to thank the Board and for	
16	all of those, here, today, who contributed	
17	their time, money and effort to making this a	
18	possibility.	
19	I am a humble person.	
20	I am not quick to assume, but, I have	
21	no doubt that the pending vote on this	
22	resolution is nothing more than one small,	
23	final administrative hurdle.	
24	Here is why; it is a minimally	
25	invasive Park.	

1	The people who want to degrade this	
2	Park took the happy foresight to say no	
3	lights, no basketball courts, just a couple	
4	jungle gyms. Page $\mid 1 \mid$	52
5	I think I actually heard someone who	
6	is opposed to the Park say the jungle gyms	
7	and the babies will get in the way of twelve	
8	years old.

8	How do you suppose the vote will turn	
9	out, if you just ask the children how you	
10	felt about a playground?	
11	The Board Members know because they	
12	care for families and their children need a	
13	voice too.	
14	Lastly, amazing job was done raising	
15	money through donations and Grants.	
16	Supervisor Santino and Members of the	
17	Board:	
18	I believe you will all agree this is

23	(Whereupon, applause from the audience

1	I understand they have their views but

5	We privately raised funds.	
6	We received Grants and now, we are	
7	coming to a screeching halt and we are	
8	reversing the decision.	
9	We need to respect the decision that	
10	was made.	
11	Thank you for your time.	
12	SUPERVISOR SANTINO: Thank you.	
13	(Whereupon, applause from the audience	
14	was heard. After, the following ensued.)
