AGREEMENT

FOR CONSULTING ENGINEER

THIS AGREEMENT, made this _____ day of ______, 20___, by and between the Town of Hempstead, a municipal corporation of the State of New York, having its principal office at the Town Hall, Town Hall Plaza, Hempstead, New York, hereinafter referred to as the "TOWN" and H2M architects + engineers having their principal office at 538 Broad Hollow Road, Melville, New York 11747 hereinafter referred to as the "CONSULTANT" WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Town Department of Water deems it desirable and necessary to obtain the services of a consulting engineer to provide services related to Electrical Improvements and Treatment System Design, East Meadow Well 11 for it's East Meadow Water District; and

WHEREAS, in response to a Request for Proposals issued but the Department of Water and publicly advertised on the Town of Hempstead website and other public and professional publications the Consultant herein submitted a proposal for these services on November 30, 2017 which is hereby made part of this agreement, representing that they are adequately staffed, skilled and experienced in the type of work proposed, and represents further that they are staffed with personnel who are duly licensed and qualified as Professional Engineers under the laws of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, the services of the Consultant for such proposed work constitute personal services; and

NOW, THEREFORE THE PARTIES HERETO MUTUALLY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

I. Subject to the direction and control of the Commissioner of Water of the Town, the Consultant agrees to perform the following work:

REVIEW OF WATER QUALITY AND POTENTIAL SOURCES

The Consultant shall:

I.

- Review historical water quality date.
- Investigate upgradient monitoring well data from NCDPW.
- Review NYSDEC spills database.
- Review UCMR data.
- Review water quality of well 11 in relation to the potential treatment of UCMR compounds.

II. <u>PRELIMINARY DESIGN – DESIGN/ENGINEERING REPORT</u>

The Consultant shall document their findings in a detailed report and prepare a preliminary design including the following information as a minimum:

1

- Preliminary design shall contain multiple process flow diagrams, sample floor and site plans to identify the scope and scale of potential treatment options.
- Report shall include preliminary cost opinions to compare approaches.
- Engineering report shall identify the history of the water supply, the site, the well and potential water quality drivers.
- Report shall summarize the options considered to treat the well and shall provide design parameters for the final design along with a cost opinion for construction.

III. SITE INVESTIGATIONS/SURVEY

The Consultant shall visit the existing facility and collect relevant constructed information. Work included under this task shall include:

- Collecting existing as-build information for the preparation of a 3D facility model.
- Utilizing an environmental specialist, survey the structure for suspected hazardous materials.
- Prepare report of environmental findings and submit to the Town
- Prepare scope of necessary remediation work to address any discovered environmental hazards.
- Review the existing electrical services.
- Perform partial site survey including topography in the area around existing and proposed facilities.
- Locate known existing utilities. (An independent subsurface utility investigation is not included in the contract costs)

IV <u>FINAL DESIGN DEVELOPMENT</u>

Final design of improvements shall be prepared including:

- Submit engineering report to NCDOH for approval.
- Finalize treatment schemes and layouts with Department of Water
- Review electrical feed data with Department of Water and determine final design scheme and layout including future loads
- Review final generator design criteria and loads and determine appropriate location of installation
- Review department needs and requirements for SCADA design and incorporation to existing system.
- Meet with the Department of Water to review comments of 30%, 60% and 90% design submissions and address Department of Water comments.
- Provide engineers estimates at critical points of design process.

V. OBTAINING AGENCY APPROVALS (PERMITS FOR APPROVALS)

The Consultant shall prepare all reports, plans and complete all applications necessary for obtaining permits and approvals from the Nassau County Department of Health. Work under this task shall include but not be limited to preparation and submission of the following permits:

• 348 permit - Construction or modification of a drinking water facility

- Article XI submission

- Diesel generator fuel storage
- Preparation of SEQR application (anticipated Type II action)

BIDDING SUPPORT

VI.

Once all approvals are obtained from all relevant regulatory agencies, the Constultant shall:

- Prepare final construction drawings for bidding purposes
- Prepare final specification for all work items to be performed
- Compile all specifications and relevant information into the necessary number of bid documents utilizing Town of Hemsptead standard bid document format
- Prepare a final engineers estimate for each contract and provide same to the

- After receipt of bids by the Town, the Consultant shall review all submitted and accepted bids, review bidder qualifications, check references, compile a bid comparison and provide a letters of recommendation for awarding the necessary contracts

VII. CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION AND INSPECTION

Work under this task shall include:

- Coordination and attendance at a Pre-Construction Conference.
- Conduct job progress meetings (max 4) at the construction site as needed.
- Review shop drawing and other submittals for compliance with contract specification and plans.
- Provide part-time construction observation, estimated to be 20 hours per week for an anticipated project duration of 270 days.
- Process Contractor Payment Requisitions.
- Review and approve all sub-contractors, material suppliers, materials, equipment and proposed substitutions.
- Perform inspection of work upon substantial completion and prepare punch list and issue same to contractor.
- Perform final inspection of completed work and issue final punch list to contractor.

VIII. COORDINATION OF PROJECT STARTUP

Consultant shall prepare a completed work approval application and submit it along with the necessary water quality and as-built drawings to Nassau County Department of Health, attend a county walk through review of the project for acceptance.

IX. FINAL PROJECT CLOSEOUT

Conult shall prepare and distribute a punch list of items to be addressed by each contractor and issue a final completion letter to the Department of Water along with received as-builts and Operation and Maintenance manuals provided by the contractors and reviewed by the consultant for completeness

II. TERMS OF COMPENSATION

A. The Town shall pay the Consultant for services listed above in accordance with the following schedule:

The Consultant shall be compensated based on submitted actual work effort as documented on submitted time sheets accompanying claims for partial payments, however the amount paid shall not exceed the total engineering costs above. All claims for pass through and reimbursable expenses shall be submitted to the Department of Water with no mark-up or claims for overhead and profit on the part of the consultant.

It is understood and agreed that the Town reserves the right to progress in such sequence and manner as it deems desirable.

The Consultant agrees that he will comply with any and all applicable provisions of the laws of the State of New York and of the Town of Hempstead and agrees to be responsible for and save the Town harmless from any and all claims, damages, costs and expenses arising from the consultant's negligent performance of the work as provided by this agreement, including damage to person or property, and the defense, settlement or satisfaction of such claims.

The Consultant's compensation shall be paid by the Town out of such moneys appropriated by the Town for the purposes herein provided. Members of any board, any other officer or agent duly authorized to act for and on behalf of the Town shall not, by virtue of such authority or action, be personally liable in any manner whatsoever to the Consultant.

The acceptance by the Consultant or any person claiming under the Consultant, of any payment made on the final payment claim under this contract, shall operate on and shall be a release to the Town from all claims and liability to the Consultant, his successors, legal representatives and assigns, for anything done or furnished under or by the provisions of this contract.

Non-Discrimination

The Consultant will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, color or national origin. The Consultant will take affirmative action to insure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, creed, color or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and the Consultant agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Town setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

In all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Consultant, the words "EQUAL OPPORTUNITY EMPLOYER" shall appear in type twice as large as that used in the body of the advertisement.

The Consultant shall secure compensation for the benefit of, and keep insured during the life of this agreement, each employee engaged on work under this agreement, in compliance with the provisions of the Workmen's Compensation Law. This agreement shall be void and of no effect unless such compensation is secured.

Since it is intended to secure the personal services of

as Consultant, this contract shall not be assigned, sublet or transferred, nor shall there be any changes in corporate officers, without the written consent of the Town.

The services to be performed by the Consultant shall at all times be subject to the direction and control of the Commissioner of Water of the Town, whose decision shall be final and binding upon the Consultant as to all matters arising out of, or in connection with, or relating to, this contract. To prevent all disputes and litigation, the Commissioner of Water shall in all cases determine the amount, quality and acceptability and fitness of the work being performed, under the provisions of the contract, and shall determine every question which may arise relative to the fulfillment of this contract on the part of the Consultant, and his estimate and decision shall be final, conclusive, and binding upon the Consultant.

The Town shall have the absolute right to abandon or suspend any work, and such action on its part shall in no event be deemed a breach of the contract. If any work shall be abandoned or suspended the Town will pay the Consultant at the rates listed in Section II for the services rendered by him to the date of such abandonment or suspension, in proportion to all the services to be rendered under the terms of this agreement, provided however, that such compensation shall in no event exceed the amount the Consultant would be entitled to pursuant to the provisions of Section II hereof.

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 62 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF HEMPSTEAD ENTITLED "DEPARTMENT OF PURCHASING" IN ORDER TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL GUIDANCE RELATIVE TO THE LOCAL CONTRACTING PREFERENCE FOR ELIGIBLE LOCAL VETERAN-OWNED SMALL BUSINESSES.

Introduced by:

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Hempstead as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Intent.

It is the purpose and intent of the Town Board to amend Chapter 62 of the Code of the Town of Hempstead entitled "Department of Purchasing" in order to provide the department with additional guidance when the Town is considering competing bids between a business that qualifies for a local preference and a business that qualifies for a local veteran-owned small business preference.

Section 2.

Chapter 62 of the Town Code entitled "Department of Purchasing" is hereby amended to read as follows:

Chapter 62 Department of Purchasing

§ 62-1 Establishment; Commissioner and Deputy Commissioner; appointment.

There shall be in the Town of Hempstead a Department of Purchasing. The executive head of such Department shall be the Commissioner of such Department, who shall be appointed by the Town Board for a term fixed by law at such salary as may, from time to time, be fixed by said Town Board. The Commissioner of Purchasing shall be vested with the authority, direction and control over the Department and may appoint a Deputy Commissioner to serve at his pleasure who shall have the rights, powers, duties, obligations and responsibilities of the Commissioner and the authority to act in his place and stead. The Commissioner shall have the power to appoint and remove all other subordinate officers and all other employees and to assign them to their respective duties. The Commissioner shall be in the unclassified service of the civil service. The Deputy Commissioner shall be deemed to occupy a confidential position to the Commissioner, and the position of such Deputy Commissioner shall be in the exempt class of the civil service.

§ 62-2 Organization; divisional duties.

A. There shall be within the Department of Purchasing the following Divisions:

- (1) Administrative Division.
- (2) Planning Division.
- B. Duties of Divisions.
- (1) Administrative Division. To have general supervision of intradepartmental matters, including supervision of personnel and maintenance of personnel records, maintenance of accounting and departmental records, including budget control and statistical analysis of overall direction and coordination of divisional activities. Accounting and departmental records shall be maintained as required by the Town Comptroller.

- (2) Planning Division. To develop a comprehensive program for the purchase of supplies, materials and equipment needed by all the various departments of the Town of Hempstead, inclusive of any other board, commission or agency functioning, directly or indirectly, under the control and jurisdiction of the Town of Hempstead.
- § 62-3 General powers and duties.

The Department of Purchasing shall have the following powers and duties:

- A. The Commissioner, subject to the provisions of § 41-a of the Town Law, shall make all purchases and contracts for supplies, materials and equipment of every kind and nature for the town and any town department, board or agency for which the town may, in any event, be liable and for any special improvement district within such town, except for a district having a separate Board of Commissioners. Before making any purchase, the Commissioner of Purchasing shall comply with such rules and regulations in relation thereto which have been or may be established by resolution of the Town Board and any and all other provisions of law as may be applicable thereto.
- B. The Commissioner shall make all purchases and contracts for supplies, materials and equipment involving an expenditure in excess of \$3,000 for the Town of Hempstead or any department of said town, board or agency for which it may, in any event, be liable, including any special improvement district within such town, provided that said district does not have a separate Board of Commissioners, in accordance with the applicable provisions of §§ 103 and 104 of the General Municipal Law.
- C. The Commissioner shall institute a system or procedure for a purchase requisition form, in duplicate, executed by a department head, setting forth the description of supplies, materials and equipment required and the estimated prices for such items and the place of delivery. The Commissioner shall prepare a request-for-quotation form, setting forth thereon the necessary information for the item or items described, stated on the purchase requisition form, and shall forward such request for quotation to prospective vendors, advising such vendors that such quotation shall be submitted to the Commissioner upon a day certain and that any quotation not submitted on or before said date shall be disregarded by said Commissioner. Upon the receipt of a quotation submitted by a prospective vendor, the Commissioner shall make a record of said quotation and shall forward the original and copy thereof to the Town Comptroller for purposes of ascertaining if there are funds available for such purchase. If there are available funds, the Comptroller shall so endorse and return same to the Commissioner, who shall award the item in question to the responsible vendor submitting the lowest quotation.
- D. The Commissioner shall establish a procedure authorizing the vendor who has been awarded a contract as to time and place of delivery and all other pertinent data relating thereto. The Commissioner shall establish a procedure, after delivery has been made and checked as to proper items purchased, for claim forms so that payment may be made to the vendor. The vendor shall keep records showing the delivery and completion of all contract awards.
- E. The Commissioner is hereby designated as the officer to receive bids on contracts for public works for the town and any department, board or agency thereof and any special improvement district thereof, except a district having a separate Board of Commissioners, and to transmit such bids to the town officer, board or agency having jurisdiction thereof for award, subject to the approval of the Town Board. The Commissioner shall maintain, update and improve the procedures currently in effect as to purchases, bidding, contracts, awards, verifying deliveries, quantity and quality controls and all pertinent methods of control to ensure proper functioning of the Department with all possible safeguards and guidelines.
- F. The Commissioner shall develop and administer effective policies and programs to expedite the purchase of supplies, materials and equipment.

- G. The Commissioner shall develop programs, personnel and facilities in conformity with and in coordination with all other purchasing agencies on all levels having an interest in this field, inclusive of but not limited to state and county agencies.
- H. The Commissioner shall participate in state and local conferences concerning methods of purchasing and improvements thereof.

§ 62-4 Transfer of existing Department; employees.

A. The Purchasing Department, presently existing by resolution, is hereby instituted in its entirety to a Department of Purchasing, including all property, equipment and budgetary appropriations. Employees of such Department shall be continued as employees in the Department of Purchasing with the same qualifications, pensions and retirement rights and privileges as they had immediately prior to such transfer.

B. The Commissioner, only when specifically authorized to do so by the Town Board, may, from time to time, employ such additional persons, including special, technical, fiscal and legal consultants, as may be necessary in the discharge of his duties.

§ 62-5 Local preference; local veteran-owned small business preference. [Added 7-27-1993 by L.L. No. 47-1993, effective 8-2-1993]

- A. Notwithstanding any provision of § 62-3C hereof to the contrary, in the case of all purchases to be made and all contracts to be awarded pursuant to § 62-3B and E hereof, except contracts awarded pursuant to § 103 of the General Municipal Law, the Commissioner may grant a local preference or a local veteran-owned small business preference and effect such purchase from, or award such contract from, or award such contract to, a responsible bidder other than the lowest responsible bidder, provided that:
 - (1) Such other bidder maintains a place of business in or sells supplies, materials or equipment manufactured in the County of Nassau and submits a bid not exceeding 5% more than the otherwise lowest responsible bidder, and provided that the bid submitted by such other bidder is the lowest bid among those received from all bidders qualifying for this local preference [or a local veteran owned small-business preference]; or
 - (2) Such other bidder is a local veteran-owned small business, as defined herein, that maintains a place of business in or sells supplies, materials or equipment manufactured in the County of Nassau and submits a bid not exceeding 7.5% more than the otherwise lowest responsible bidder, and provided that the bid submitted by such other bidder is the lowest bid among those received from all bidders qualifying for [the local preference or] this local veteran-owned small business preference, and does not exceed the bid of the otherwise lowest responsible bidder who gualifies for the local preference contained in subsection (1) above by more than 2.5%.

B. For purposes of this section, a "local veteran-owned small business" shall include any entity that maintains:

i. A current certification as a Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business enterprise issued by the New York State Office of General Services Division of Service-Disabled Veterans' Business Development, and maintains its place of business in or sells supplies, materials or equipment manufactured in the County of Nassau; or

ii.

A current verification as a Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business or a Veteran-Owned Small Business issued by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), and maintains its place of business in or sells supplies, materials or equipment manufactured in the County of Nassau.

C. No entity deemed eligible to utilize the local or local veteran-owned small business preferences contained in this section may utilize more than one preference for any purchase or contract with the Town of Hempstead.

§ 62-6 Written certification on contracts.

A. Definitions. As used in this section, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

AMERICAN ALLIED NATION

- (1) Any nation that is a member of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.
- (2) Any country that is a signatory to the Southeast Asian Treaty Organization.
- (3) Any country, other than Venezuela, that is a signatory to the RIO Treaty of 1947.

(4) Ireland.

- (5) Israel.
- (6) Japan.
- (7) The Republic of Korea.

BOYCOTT OF AMERICAN-ALLIED NATION

Engaging in refusals to deal with, terminating activities with, or other actions that are intended to limit commercial relations with an American-allied nation or individuals or companies doing business in an American-allied nation or in American-allied-nationcontrolled territories, when such actions are taken:

- (1) In a manner that discriminates on the basis of nationality, national origin, religion or other unreasonable basis that is not founded on a valid business reason.
- (2) In compliance or adherence to calls for a boycott of an American-allied nation other than those boycotts to which 50 U.S.C. § 2407(c) applies.
- COMPANY

Any sole proprietorship, organization, association, corporation, partnership, joint venture, limited partnership, limited liability partnership, limited liability company or other entity or business association, including all wholly owned subsidiaries, majority-owned subsidiaries, parent companies or affiliates of such entities or business associations that exists for the purposes of making profit.

- B. The Town shall not enter into a contract with an individual or company if the contract is related to construction or the provision of services, supplies or information technology unless the contract includes a written certification that such individual or company is not currently engaged in or agrees for the duration of the contract not to engage in a boycott of an American-allied nation.
- C. The Town Board shall give the vendor 30 days' notice of the intent to rescind the contract. If the Town Board determines by a preponderance of the evidence that the party to a contract has signed the certification but has engaged in a boycott as defined in Subsection A of this section of the Town Code, the contract may be rescinded by resolution and the Town may seek reliance damages based on the signed certification not being honored.

Section 3.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
