WHEREAS, the TOWN has since provided funding and undertook the restoration of Rock Hall, which opened on May 9, 1953. In 1962 the TOWN entered into an agreement with the Society for the Preservation of Long Island Antiquities (SPLIA) to assist the TOWN and community volunteers in the curatorial and supervisory roles needed at the time and expanded that agreement in 1978. SPLIA and the TOWN mutually dissolved the agreement in 2016; and

**THE FRIENDS OF ROCK HALL**

WHEREAS, in 1976 the FRIENDS was incorporated and since that time has worked diligently and tirelessly to raise funds for Rock Hall and to provide historic programs, seminars, fairs, and other activities for the public. The FRIENDS have also raised money for furnishings, including period furniture and accessories, i.e. bedding, window treatments, etc.; and

WHEREAS, in order to continue and expand upon its not-for-profit work of educating the general public, the FRIENDS wish to continue same under an agreement with the TOWN recognizing the FRIENDS as stewards of Rock Hall.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits, covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

Subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, the TOWN hereby grants the FRIENDS a ten (10) year license pursuant to this Stewardship Agreement, commencing as of the dated first above written, to assist in the promotion and support of Rock Hall along with the TOWN and for the FRIENDS to adequately, diligently and transparently perform its not-for-profit work fostering the historical significance of Rock Hall. This Stewardship Agreement may be extended for an additional term(s), subject to such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed to by the parties in writing at the time of such extension(s).

## **I. OPERATIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES**

A. The FRIENDS shall be permitted hereunder in accordance with generally accepted standards for comparable facilities, to generate revenue from admission charges for programs provided by the FRIENDS at Rock Hall, sales from its gift shop, organizing and conducting classes, special events and exhibitions within Rock Hall and its grounds, and holding fund raising events to generate additional revenue to increase the visibility of Rock Hall. As of the date of this Agreement and for many years prior thereto, the Town has not assessed a "general admission fee" to members of the public who tour Rock Hall. Rather, the Town has opted to permit voluntary donations left at Rock Hall to exclusively go to benefit the supportive activities of the FRIENDS, as further described in Section VI herein.

## **II. OPERATIONAL CONTROLS**

A. The FRIENDS are governed by a Board of Directors, whose members serve without compensation of any kind. Any and all activities conducted by the FRIENDS at Rock Hall shall be with the prior authorization and oversight of the TOWN. Consistent with its mission statement, the FRIENDS shall be restricted in the use of revenue, with such monies to be used exclusively for the continuation, improvement and natural expansion of the FRIENDS and the Rock Hall's missions, and for no other purposes.

B. In light of their long-standing harmonious relationship that has evolved over time with respect to the TOWN'S widely acclaimed Rock Hall historic landmark facility, the parties wish to, among other things, memorialize the fact that they are not currently, nor have they ever been, affiliated entities in any sense. The FRIENDS plays an important complementary fundraising role to that of the TOWN'S ownership, management and operation of Rock Hall, for

which the TOWN is most grateful. However, in recognition of such decades old close working relationship devoted to promoting the many wonderful attributes of Rock Hall, the parties further desire to stipulate for purposes of clarification and to avoid the possibility of confusion or misinterpretation, their mutual understanding that neither the TOWN, nor its employees, shall play any role or be involved to any extent with the FRIENDS' ongoing solicitation of prospective contributions to the FRIENDS via membership drives or the like; nor shall the TOWN or its employees play any role or be involved in any manner with the handling of cash receipts and/or checks or that are a by-product of the FRIENDS' fundraising activities. In that regard, the parties hereby acknowledge and confirm that the FRIENDS have assured the TOWN that the FRIENDS maintains its own system of internal financial controls and accounting systems managed by its own employees/volunteers that are charged with the handling of cash receipts, cash disbursements and the like, as well as the transfer of receivables and payables and associated banking activities. Toward this end, the FRIENDS have advised the TOWN that its Treasurer visits Rock Hall periodically for, among other reasons, to collect and administer donations that have been left at Rock Hall for the benefit of the FRIENDS; said donations being deposited in a segregated lock box clearly labeled for the deposit of donations to the FRIENDS. The parties hereto further acknowledge their respective understanding and mutual agreement that any and all donations from the FRIENDS for the benefit/improvement of Rock Hall – whether in the form of cash, artifacts, supplies or the like - will be subject to the approval of the Town through the vehicle of a duly considered and approved Town Board Resolution.



### **III. EDUCATIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES**

The FRIENDS shall provide educational programs for the benefit of TOWN residents and visitors, and develop and promote activities for the purpose of explaining and exploring Rock Hall and its residents, the historical events that took place there, including its involvement in the American Revolution up to the present. All activities held by the FRIENDS under the auspices of Rock Hall, whether held at Rock Hall or not, must be approved in writing in advance by the TOWN, including, without limitation, the approval of any groups invited to Rock Hall by the FRIENDS. Other activities or events sponsored by the FRIENDS, which are neither related to Rock Hall nor the duties and/or obligations contained within this Stewardship Agreement, do not require approval by the TOWN, except that any event or activity held at Rock Hall or on its property requires prior written approval by the TOWN.

### **IV. MAINTENANCE**

A. The TOWN is responsible for the maintenance of the buildings and grounds of Rock Hall, including payment of electric, gas, water, fuel, telephone and internet. In recognition of both the age of the Rock Hall facility and the fact that the TOWN owns the facility, no interior or exterior work shall be performed by the FRIENDS at Rock Hall including, but not limited to, structural and electrical work.

B. No consultants shall be retained by the FRIENDS in connection with the Rock Hall premises, and no independent testing shall be performed, without prior written TOWN approval. If such consultants or testing are so approved by the TOWN in writing, the FRIENDS shall provide the TOWN with a copy of all written reports prepared in connection with same.

C. Subject in all cases to Section VI herein and as referenced in Section I herein, the FRIENDS shall retain all proceeds from sales in its museum gift shop as well as all of the proceeds generated from FRIENDS sponsored (not TOWN sponsored) programs held at Rock Hall. Nothing herein shall prevent the FRIENDS from raising money or obtaining private donations and subscriptions for the benefit and improvement of Rock Hall and its collections or for special projects within the purposes of the FRIENDS mission.

#### **V. ACCOUNTING**

A. The FRIENDS shall maintain accurate accounting records consistent with accounting principles applicable to not-for-profit organizations containing complete and transparent information with respect to receipts collected and disbursements made in connection with any and all of its Rock Hall related activities and said records shall be available to the TOWN for review and inspection upon reasonable notice. In the event the TOWN requests copies of the FRIENDS accounting records, same will be provided to the TOWN, including, without limitation, in conjunction with any and all FOIL requests received by the TOWN that may relate to Rock Hall.

#### **VI. FINANCING**

A. All revenues from donations made by visitors to Rock Hall and 100 (100%) percent of the proceeds generated from FRIENDS sponsored program admission charges collected from visitors to Rock Hall during the term of this Agreement are to be retained by the FRIENDS, using said funds to defray program expenses for speakers, special programs, educational seminars, children's garden classes, and other programs provided for children and adults. Prices fixed for admission to the facility or for classes, seminars, historic plays, etc. are to be approved

by the TOWN in advance in writing from time to time.

**VII. THE COLLECTIONS**

The FRIENDS hereby acknowledge and confirm their understanding that the TOWN owns any and all historical collections contained in Rock Hall except for those collections that are on loan to Rock Hall from other museums, historical societies or families.

**VIII. INSURANCE**

A. The TOWN has insurance in the amount of \$ \_\_\_\_\_ covering it under the TOWN'S fine arts policy. The TOWN shall cause its liability insurance, if available, to be endorsed so as to cover the FRIENDS as an additional named insured. If the TOWN self-insures for liability, consistent with policies established for other TOWN-owned buildings and property, the TOWN shall only be liable for suits or claims brought as a result of the negligence of the TOWN. The TOWN shall not be liable for suits or claims brought as a result of any program, fund-raising event or other function held off-premises. The TOWN shall furnish annually to the FRIENDS evidence of the existence of the insurance coverage required herein.

B. The FRIENDS have liability insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000/2,000,000 with Philadelphia Insurance Company. The FRIENDS will provide the TOWN with a Certificate of Insurance, naming the TOWN of Hempstead as "Additional Insured".

**IX. INDEMNIFICATION**

A. The FRIENDS shall be responsible for and shall indemnify and hold harmless the TOWN, its officers, employees and agents from and against any and all liabilities, losses, costs, expenses (including, without limitation, attorney's fees and disbursement) and damages, arising

out of or in connection with any of the FRIENDS negligent acts or omissions relating to Rock Hall.

B. The TOWN shall be responsible for and shall indemnify and hold harmless the FRIENDS, its officers, employees and agents from and against any and all liabilities, losses, costs, expenses (including, without limitation, attorney's fees and disbursement) and damages, arising out of or in connection with any of the TOWN's negligent acts or omissions relating to Rock Hall.

C. The provisions of this section shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

#### **X. EAST WING OF ROCK HALL**

A. The living quarters on the east side of Rock Hall are a private residence and excluded from the terms and conditions of this Stewardship Agreement.

#### **XI. MISCELLANEOUS**

A. The FRIENDS hereby covenant and stipulate that no person shall be denied equal opportunity to access their sponsored Rock Hall programs and their Rock Hall based gift shop. The FRIENDS further stipulate and agree that no person in their organization and no person in the course of attending the FRIENDS sponsored Rock Hall programs and/or its Rock Hall based gift shop, shall be subject to discriminatory action because of race, color, sex, creed, religion, country of origin, age, marital status, veteran status, disability, sexual orientation, or any other characteristics protected by federal, state or local law and the FRIENDS hereby agree that it shall hold harmless, indemnify, and defend the TOWN from any and all actions or complaints relative to any such alleged discrimination and shall pay any and all reasonable attorney's fees actually expended by the TOWN in defense thereof.

B. In connection with the performance of its stewardship duties hereunder, the FRIENDS shall comply with all applicable ordinances of the TOWN and laws and regulation of the County of Nassau, the State of New York and all Federal Laws, including, without limitation, those pertaining to records retention and save and hold harmless the TOWN from and against any and all claims and actions related thereto, and pay any and all reasonable attorney's fees actually expended by the TOWN in defense thereof.

C. The FRIENDS acknowledge that it neither has, nor obtains any rights, whether at law or in equity, to extend this Stewardship Agreement beyond the initial ten (10) year term. The FRIENDS further acknowledges that it has obtained no property rights in any property of the TOWN, whether real or personal, by virtue of this Stewardship Agreement and hereby agrees and covenants with the TOWN that it will not pursue any claim for deprivation of property rights or other rights by virtue of the expiration of this Stewardship Agreement.

D. Nothing herein contained shall constitute the FRIENDS or the FRIENDS employees/volunteers as agents or employees of the TOWN, it being the intention of the parties that the FRIENDS is and shall remain an independent contractor of the TOWN and that each shall be responsible for the supervision and control of their respective operations, including, without limitation, supervising and controlling their own personnel and/or volunteers if any.

E. This Stewardship Agreement is personal to the FRIENDS and accordingly the FRIENDS shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet, or otherwise dispose of this Stewardship Agreement or of its right, title, or interest herein, or its power to execute such Stewardship Agreement, without the previous consent, in writing, of the TOWN.

F. The FRIENDS hereby represent and warrant that it has the full right, power and

authority to execute, deliver and perform this Stewardship Agreement. This Stewardship Agreement will constitute a valid and binding obligations of the FRIENDS enforceable in accordance with its respective terms, except as any be limited by equitable principles of law and bankruptcy, insolvency, moratorium, and similar laws affecting creditors' rights generally.

G. The TOWN, acting by and through its Commissioner of the Department of Parks and Recreation ("Commissioner"), shall review and approve any and all FRIENDS publications, brochures, newsletters, and the like relating in any manner to Rock Hall prior to dissemination thereof by the FRIENDS.

H. This Stewardship Agreement sets forth the entire agreement and understanding of the parties hereto in respect of the subject matter contained herein and supersedes all prior agreements, promises, understandings, letters of intent, covenants, arrangements, communications, representations or warranties, whether oral or written, by any party hereto or by any related or unrelated party.

I. All questions pertaining to the validity, construction, execution and performance of this Stewardship Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York without giving effect to the conflicts or choice of law provisions thereof.

J. All notices given to the FRIENDS may be served by mailing the same to the FRIENDS at the address hereinbefore set forth by certified mail, return receipt requested or by hand delivery. All notices required to be given to the TOWN may be served by mailing the same to TOWN by certified mail return receipt requested, or delivering a copy thereof to: Town of Hempstead, Department of Parks and Recreation, 200 North Franklin Street, Hempstead, New York, 11550-1390, Attn: Office of the Commissioner.

K. In the event of any material deficiencies, breaches or violations of this Stewardship Agreement by the FRIENDS, a thirty (30) calendar day notice will be given to the FRIENDS by the TOWN or Commissioner to correct such deficiencies, breaches or violations. In the event that the FRIENDS fail to correct such deficiencies, breaches or violations within this thirty (30) calendar day period, to the reasonable satisfaction of the Commissioner, the TOWN may terminate this Agreement.


L. The TOWN further reserves the right to terminate this Agreement forthwith at any time in the event of a default, breach, or violation by the FRIENDS of any of the following provisions of the Agreement. If the FRIENDS or any of its officers, directors, or employees or volunteers, as the case may be, become convicted of a felony or commits an act of moral turpitude, it shall be grounds for immediate termination. The FRIENDS expressly waives any and all claims for damages and loss against the TOWN, or its officers, employees and agents, for or on account of any act done, caused to be done, or their failure to for any act, in exercising any or all these rights.



**WHEREAS**, in order to obtain an EMS operating certificate, the Town must file a written request with SEMSO in care of the Bureau of Emergency Medical Services (BEMS), and said written request must include a resolution from the municipal legislative body empowering the municipality to establish and operate a certified EMS services; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town must also make a statement of need, a statement establishing the type of service, a statement declaring the area to be served, and the date the resolution is to take effect pursuant to New York State Department of Health's BEMS Policy Statement of January 6, 2009;

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of the Department of Parks & Recreation, on behalf of the Town, executed a short term contract with J.W. Security, LLC for the rendering of armed guard services for the period starting December 21, 2018 and expiring January 31, 2019, with the expectation that the Town would initiate and complete a customary bidding process seeking a longer term armed guard security services contract during this short term interim period; and

## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), dated November 26, 2018 (Effective Date), is made between **National Recreation and Park Association**, a New York-based not-for-profit 501(c)3 with a mailing address of 22377 Belmont Ridge Road, Ashburn, Virginia, 20148 (NRPA) and **Town of Hempstead**, a provider of park, recreation, or community services in Hempstead, New York with a mailing address of One Washington Street, Hempstead, New York 11550 (Grantee).

### 1. Purpose

The purpose of this MOU is to confirm approval of the terms governing the acceptance and use of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (**\$150,000**) made available to Grantee for the implementation of the agreed upon public park improvements (Project).

Made possible through the support of American Water Charitable Foundation, NRPA is managing the administration of the Building Better Communities Grant Program (Program). Grants made through this Program are intended to:

- Create opportunities for nature-based play in local parks
- Educate people about the environment, particularly water resource stewardship
- Encourage community and American Water employee volunteerism

Having been selected as a recipient of funding through this Program, Grantee is required to accept the terms contained within this MOU in order to receive funding as a grant recipient.

### 2. Project Funding

- A. Within 30 days upon execution of this MOU, NRPA will send Grantee a check in the amount of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (**\$150,000**)
- B. Funds will be distributed by NRPA
- C. No matching funds are required

### 3. Grantee Requirements

Grantee will:

- A. Build, renovate or improve play space(s) at East Lake Park, in alignment with Grantee's attached proposal.
- B. Complete Project by November 30, 2019
- C. Submit monthly reports to NRPA, including:
  - Summary of the Project status
  - Changes to the budget
  - Records of public outreach and press coverage
  - Update on American Water employee and community engagement events
  - Timeline for planned Project completion and recognition
  - Photos showing current progress
- D. Submit quarterly reports (dates provided by NRPA 1 month ahead of time), including:
  - Brief one paragraph summary of activities
  - 5-6 pictures documenting activities
- E. Host a site visit(s) for NRPA and/or American Water Charitable Foundation
- F. Host event(s) for volunteer days including American Water employees and the community that contribute to the Project through hands-on activities as well as for project milestones like the groundbreaking and grand opening
- G. Install permanent signage recognizing American Water Charitable Foundation's donation, to be mutually agreed upon and approved in advance

- H. Promote receipt of grant and success of Project through press release, on-site dedication event, and ongoing social media
- I. Submit a final report (template provided by NRPA) explaining the success of the project and how the grant funds were utilized upon completion of the project

#### **4. Promotion**

NRPA and American Water Charitable Foundation may use the Grantee and/or park names, photos, and/or information in connection with the Project for promotional or other purposes associated with the Program, in any and all media, without limitation and without further payment, notification, or permission, except where prohibited by law.

In all public statements concerning the grant or Program, the grantor shall be recognized as "American Water Charitable Foundation". Whenever possible, recognition should also be provided to "National Recreation and Park Association".

**The Grantee may make public statements regarding the grant, including the identity of Grantor and American Water Charitable Foundation and the total amount of the grant, provided that any such statements and use of grantor logos related to this grant have been approved in advance in writing by Grantor.**

#### **5. Limits of Liability**

Neither NRPA, nor American Water Charitable Foundation or any of its respective parents, subsidiaries, affiliates, officers, directors or employees shall be liable to Grantee and/or its affiliates for any liability of any kind relating to or arising out of participation in this Project hereunder.

#### **6. Confidentiality**

During the term of this MOU, the parties may learn certain confidential information of each other. For purposes of this MOU, confidential information means the confidential and proprietary information, not generally known by non-party personnel, used by the disclosing party and which is proprietary to the disclosing party, and includes, without limitation, the disclosing party's trade secret or proprietary personnel, financial, marketing and business information, including strategic, operations and other business plans or forecasts, and confidential information provided by the disclosing party regarding its employees, customers, vendors, sponsors and other contractors. Confidential information shall not be disclosed to non-party personnel.

#### **7. Term**

The term of this MOU will commence on the Effective Date and shall continue until November 30, 2019.

#### **8. Use of Grant Funds**

The Grantee shall use the full amount of the grant for the purposes set forth in Section 1. Unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Grantor, the Grantee shall return any portion of the grant and the income earned thereon that is not expended for such purposes.

The Grantee agrees not to use any portion of the grant or any income derived from the grant for the following:

- A. To carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation within the meaning of Section 4945(d)(1) of the Code;
- B. To influence the outcome of any specific public election or to carry on, directly or indirectly, any voter registration drive within the meaning of Section 4945(d)(2) of the Code;
- C. To provide a grant to an individual for travel, study, or similar purpose within the meaning of Section 4945(g) of the Code, without prior written approval of Grantor.

- D. Payments of salaries, other compensation, or expense reimbursement to employees of the Grantee within the scope of their employment do not constitute "grants" for these purposes and are not subject to these restrictions;
- E. Except as expressly may be authorized in the Grant Description, to provide a grant to any other organization without prior written approval of the Grantor; or
- F. To promote or engage in criminal acts of violence, terrorism, hate crimes, the destruction of any state, or discrimination on the basis of race, national origin, religion, military and veteran status, disability, sex, age, or sexual orientation, or support of any entity that engages in these activities.

All unspent or uncommitted grant funds shall be invested in highly liquid investments (such as an interest-bearing bank account) with the primary objective being preserving the grant funds availability for the project. Any interest or other income generated by the grant funds must be applied to the purposes described in the Grant Description.

**9. Audit**

NRPA has the right to audit the Grantee's financial records relating to this MOU. Grantee should maintain their financial receipts and must make the records available at any time as requested by NRPA. If as a result of an audit, NRPA determines that funds were not spent in accordance with the purposes of this grant, the grantee may be required to return any funds not substantiated. If NRPA determines that grant funds were used for fraudulent purposes, the grantee may be barred from participation in any further programs.

**10. Termination**

Either party may terminate this MOU at any time effective upon receipt of written notice by the other party of failure to perform. The non-performing party shall have sixty (60) days to cure its obligation. If the non-performing party fails to satisfactorily cure its obligation within this time this MOU will be terminated.

Neither party shall be liable to the other by reason of termination of this MOU for compensation, reimbursement or damages for any loss of prospective profits on anticipated sales or for expenditures, investments, leases or other commitments relating to the business or goodwill of any of the parties, notwithstanding any law to the contrary. No termination of this MOU shall release the obligation to pay any sums due to the terminating party which accrued prior to such termination.

**WHEREAS**, recently enacted provisions of New York State law require employers to adopt written sexual harassment prevention policies and to provide for annual anti-harassment training for employees; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town retained the services of Jackson Lewis P.C. to review the Town's existing Policy, to recommend amendments to the Policy, and to train Town employees under the amended Policy; and

**WHEREAS**, in order to comply with the provisions of state law, amendments to the existing Policy have been recommended, a copy of which is annexed hereto (the "Amended Policy"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Board wishes to formally adopt the Amended Policy as the Town's official policy against discrimination, harassment and sexual harassment.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT**

**RESOLVED** that the Town Board does hereby adopt the Amended Policy, a copy of which is annexed hereto, as the Town's official policy against discrimination, harassment and sexual harassment; and be it further

TOWN OF HEMPSTEAD  
POLICY AGAINST DISCRIMINATION, HARASSMENT AND SEXUAL HARASSMENT

Policy against Discrimination

It is the policy of the Town of Hempstead to provide equal employment opportunity in all employment-related matters, including hiring, training, promotion, compensation, benefits, transfers and other personnel actions, without regard to age, creed, race, color, religion, sex, gender identity or gender expression (including transgender status), sexual orientation, national origin, marital status, disability, military status, domestic violence victim status, criminal or arrest record, predisposing genetic characteristics or any other characteristic protected by federal, state, or local Law. As part of this policy, the Town shall endeavor to provide:

- Open communication to address each employee's concerns and expectations and recognition of the need for constructive and timely feedback;
- A safe and healthy working environment;
- An environment where there is zero tolerance of harassment, discrimination, or retaliation against any employee by a co-worker, vendor, or member of the public;
- Reasonable accommodation to enable otherwise qualified individuals with a disability to perform the essential function of their jobs unless an undue hardship would result;
- Reasonable accommodation to applicants' and employees' religious beliefs and practices unless an undue hardship would result; and
- Easily used procedures to report to the Human Resources Department/Town Attorney's Office, regarding disputes with co-workers, harassment, sexual harassment, discrimination, retaliation or any similar concerns.

Further, it is the policy of the Town to comply with all Equal Employment Opportunity obligations. The Town's Equal Employment Opportunity Officer is responsible for monitoring compliance with the Town's EEO obligations.



### Policy against Harassment

The Town has a zero tolerance policy for harassment or discrimination of any employee by a supervisor, employee, vendor, or member of the public with whom you interact as part of your job. This zero tolerance for harassing or discriminatory conduct applies to harassment or discrimination on the basis of age, creed, race, color, religion, sex, gender identity or gender expression (including transgender status), sexual orientation, national origin, marital status, disability, military status, domestic violence victim status, criminal or arrest record, predisposing genetic characteristics or any other characteristic protected by federal, state or local law. We are also committed to making reasonable accommodation to the disabilities and religious beliefs and practices of applicants or employees; and to providing medical and other leaves of absence as stated in the CBA, and under federal or state Law. Examples of prohibited conduct include, but are not limited to:

- Demeaning or degrading posters, magazine, objects, calendars, cartoons, or caricatures;
- Racial, age-based or other offensive, inappropriate comments or jokes;
- Insulting or insensitive religious-based comments or conduct;
- Teasing or other similar conduct regarding a co-worker's background, country of origin or accent;
- The sending of inappropriate e-mails or other offensive materials; and
- Obscene or suggestive gestures, looks, or motions.

### Policy against Sexual Harassment

The Town prohibits sexual harassment and retaliation of or against its applicants, interns, contractors, volunteers or employees by another employee, supervisor, customer, client, vendor or other third party in all aspects of the employment relationship including: recruitment, hiring, placement, promotion, transfer, training, compensation, benefits, activities, access to programs and treatment. This policy is one component of the Town's commitment to a discrimination-free work environment.

## **SEXUAL HARASSMENT DEFINED**

Sexual harassment is a form of sex discrimination that violates Town policy and is unlawful under federal, New York State and local law (as applicable). Sexual harassment includes unwelcome conduct which is either of a sexual nature or which is directed at an individual because of that individual's sex or gender (including pregnancy, childbirth and related medical conditions), gender identity or gender expression (including transgender status), and/or sexual orientation when:

Submission to such conduct or those advances or requests is made either an explicit or an implicit term or condition of an individual's employment;

- Submission to or rejection of such conduct or advances or requests is used as a basis for an employment decision, which might either positively or adversely affect an individual;
- The conduct or advances or requests have the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's work performance or creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive working environment, even if the individual is not the intended target.

Sexual harassment can be verbal (e.g., jokes, insults, gestures or teasing), visual (e.g., offensive posters, symbols, cartoons, drawings, computer displays, text messages, social media posts or e-mails) or physical conduct (e.g., unwanted touching, physically threatening another) that denigrates or shows hostility or aversion towards an individual based on sex or gender, gender identity, gender expression and/or sexual orientation.

Examples of conduct that violate this policy include:

- unwelcome sexual advances, flirtations, advances, leering, whistling, touching, pinching, assault, blocking normal movement
- requests for sexual favors or demands for sexual favors in exchange for favorable treatment
- obscene or vulgar gestures, posters, or comments
- sexual jokes, noises, or comments about a person's body, sexual prowess, sexuality, sexual experience, or sexual deficiencies
- propositions, or suggestive or insulting comments of a sexual nature
- derogatory cartoons, posters, and drawings
- sexually-explicit e-mails, text messages, posts or voicemails
- conversation about one's own or someone else's sex life
- conduct or comments consistently targeted at only one gender, even if the content is not sexual
- teasing or other conduct directed toward a person because of the person's gender
- sex stereotyping

## **RETALIATION DEFINED**

Retaliation is adverse conduct taken because an individual reported an actual or perceived violation of this policy, opposed practices prohibited by this policy, participated in the reporting and investigation process set forth in this policy or testified or assisted in an investigation or proceeding involving an actual or perceived violation of this policy. Adverse conduct includes, but is not limited to any action that would keep an employee from reporting sexual harassment or retaliation; shunning and avoiding an individual who reports sexual harassment or retaliation; express or implied threats or intimidation intended to prevent an individual from reporting sexual harassment or retaliation; and denying employment benefits because an applicant or employee reported or encouraged another employee to report sexual harassment or retaliation or participated in the reporting and investigation process.

## **REPORTING PROCEDURE**

The Town cannot prevent harassment or sexual harassment unless it knows about it. If an employee believes someone has violated this policy, the employee should promptly bring the matter to the immediate attention of his/her department head, William Sammon of Human Resources available at extension 3407, or any member of management with whom the employee feels comfortable. Reports of sexual harassment may be made verbally or in writing. Written complaints can be submitted internally using a complaint form. The complaint form can be found in Human Resources and all Department offices, without difficulty. If the employee makes a complaint under this policy and has not received a satisfactory response within ten (10) business days, the employee should contact Albina Kataeva, Esq. of the Office of the Town Attorney available at extension 3407 immediately.

Every supervisor who learns of any employee's concern about conduct in violation of this policy, whether in a formal complaint or informally, must immediately report the issues raised to William Sammon of Human Resources available at extension 3407.

If it is after regular business hours and any of the above referenced individuals are not available please contact the Public Safety Desk Officer at 489-5000 or 538-1900. The failure to timely report an alleged violation of this policy may lead to disciplinary action up to and including termination of employment.

## **INVESTIGATION PROCEDURE**

Upon receiving a complaint, the Town will timely conduct a fair and thorough investigation into any claim of a violation of this policy to ensure due process for all parties. The Town will endeavor to keep the reporting employee's concerns confidential. However, complete confidentiality may not be possible in all circumstances. Employees are required to cooperate in investigations conducted pursuant to this policy.

During the investigation, the Town generally will interview the complainant and the accused, conduct further interviews as necessary and review documents or other information the investigator believes are relevant.

Upon completion of the investigation, the Town will determine whether this policy has been violated based upon its reasonable, good-faith evaluation of the information gathered during the investigation. The Town will inform the complainant and the accused of the results of the investigation.

Any employee found to have engaged in conduct in violation of this policy will be considered to have engaged in employee misconduct. Individuals who violate this policy (which includes supervisory or management personnel who fail to report or knowingly allow sexually harassing behavior to continue) will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination from employment. Individuals who engage in conduct that rises to the level of a violation of law can be held personally liable for such conduct.

#### **LEGAL PROTECTIONS AND EXTERNAL REMEDIES.**

Aside from the internal complaint process at the Town, employees may choose to pursue external legal remedies, including seeking compensation, with the following governmental entities at any time.

##### **1. New York State Division of Human Rights (DHR)**

The Human Rights Law (HRL), codified as N.Y. Executive Law, art. 15, § 290 et seq., applies to employers in New York State with regard to sexual harassment, and protects employees, paid or unpaid interns and non-employees regardless of immigration status. A complaint alleging violation of the Human Rights Law may be filed either with DHR or in New York State Supreme Court. Complaints with DHR may be filed any time within one year of the harassment. If an individual did not file at DHR, they can sue directly in state court under the HRL, within three years of the alleged discrimination. An individual may not file with DHR if they have already filed a HRL complaint in state court.

Complaining internally to the Town does not extend your time to file with DHR or in court. The one year or three years is counted from date of the most recent incident of harassment. You do not need an attorney to file a complaint with DHR, and there is no cost to file with DHR.

DHR will investigate your complaint and determine whether there is probable cause to believe that discrimination has occurred. Probable cause cases are forwarded to a public hearing before an administrative law judge. If discrimination is found after a hearing, DHR has the power to award relief, which varies but may include requiring your employer to take action to stop the harassment, or redress the damage caused, including paying monetary damages, attorney's fees and civil fines.

The website has a complaint form that can be downloaded, filled out, notarized and mailed to DHR. The website also contains contact information for DHR's regional offices across New York State.

## **2. United States Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC)**

The EEOC enforces federal anti-discrimination laws, including Title VII of the 1964 federal Civil Rights Act (codified as 42 U.S.C. § 2000e et seq.). An individual can file a complaint with the EEOC anytime within 300 days from the harassment. There is no cost to file a complaint with the EEOC. The EEOC will investigate the complaint, and determine whether there is reasonable cause to believe that discrimination has occurred, at which point the EEOC will issue a Right to Sue letter permitting the individual to file a complaint in federal court.

The EEOC does not hold hearings or award relief, but may take other action including pursuing cases in federal court on behalf of complaining parties. Federal courts may award remedies if discrimination is found to have occurred.

If an employee believes that they have been discriminated against at work, they can file a "Charge of Discrimination." The EEOC has district, area, and field offices where complaints can be filed.

If an individual filed an administrative complaint with DHR, DHR will file the complaint with the EEOC to preserve the right to proceed in federal court.

### **3. Local Protections**

Many localities enforce laws protecting individuals from sexual harassment and discrimination. An individual should contact the county, city or town in which they live to find out if such a law exists. For example, employees who work in Nassau County can file complaints of sexual harassment with the Nassau County Commission on Human Rights (240 Old Country Road, 6<sup>th</sup> Floor, Suite 606, Mineola, NY 11501; 516-571-3662; [www.nassaucountyny.gov/414/Human-Rights-Commission](http://www.nassaucountyny.gov/414/Human-Rights-Commission)).

### **4. Contact the Local Police Department**

If the harassment involves physical touching, coerced physical confinement or coerced sex acts, the conduct may constitute a crime. Contact the local police department.

## CONSULTING AGREEMENT

This Consulting Agreement (the "Agreement" or "Consulting Agreement") states the terms and conditions that govern the contractual agreement between Diane Madden, having a principal place of business at 243 Cherry Place, East Meadow, NY ("Consultant"), and the Town of Hempstead ("Client") who agree to be bound by this Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Consultant offers consulting services in the field of Animal Rescue Coordination; and

**1. Term:** This Agreement shall begin on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2019 and continue for a period of ninety (90) days unless terminated prior to such term end.

- a. Either Party may terminate this Agreement for any reason or no reason immediately upon written notice to the other Party. Effective written notice shall be understood to include the use of email and/or text message to the address or phone number provided by Consultant or by delivery by any common carrier or the US Postal Service.

**2. Consulting Services:** The Consultant agrees that it shall provide its expertise to the Client for all things pertaining to the promotion of animal rescue through the Animal Shelter as expressed in Exhibit "A" "Scope of Services" (the "Consulting Services").

**3. Compensation:** In consideration for the Consulting Services, the Client shall pay the Consultant at the rate of THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,000.00) per 30-day period not to exceed NINE-THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$9,000.00) in total. The Consultant shall fill out a Town of Hempstead Claim Form and invoice the Client not less than once every 30 days and such invoices shall be due and payable within 30 days of the Client's receipt of the invoice. The invoice shall provide sufficient information and documentation to allow the Town to properly ascertain that the invoice amount is properly due and payable.

In the event this Agreement is terminated, Consultant shall, upon providing Client an invoice and Town of Hempstead Claim Form, be entitled to a pro-rata payment at the hourly rate of \$50.00 (FIFTY DOLLARS) per hour worked not previously paid and within the limitations expressed herein.

  
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**4. Intellectual Property Rights in Work Product:** The Parties acknowledge and agree that the Client will hold all intellectual property rights in any work product resulting from the Consulting Services including, but not limited to, copyright and trademark rights. The Consultant agrees not to claim any such ownership in such work product's intellectual property at any time prior to or after the completion and delivery of such work product to the Client.

**5. Confidentiality:** Consultant shall not disclose to any third party any details regarding the Client's business, including, without limitation any information regarding any of the Client's practices, policies, scheduling, purchasing, procurement, personnel information, expenditures, or the like (the Confidential Information).

Consultant shall not make copies of any Confidential Information or any documentation contained within the Confidential Information for personal use or for distribution unless requested to do so by the Client.

Consultant shall use Confidential Information solely for the benefit of the Client and no other.

**6. Non-solicitation of Employees:** Consultant will not, directly or indirectly, recruit, solicit, or induce, or attempt to recruit, solicit, or induce, any of Client's employees, or contractors for information or documentation not otherwise provided by Client to Consultant. Client shall supply Consultant with a point-of-contact person who will act as liaison between Client and Consultant.

**7. Work Location:** Consultant shall base its operations from Consultant's office. Client shall not be required to provide Consultant with any computer, phone, fax, or electronic communication devices or programs nor shall Client be required to provide Consultant any workspace whatsoever.

All information and/or documentation necessary for Consultant to provide Consulting Services shall be provided by Client via email.

**8. Consultant Liaison:** Unless otherwise designated, in Client's sole discretion, Consultant Liaison shall be understood to be the Town Attorney's designee assigned to the Town Attorney's Office.

**9. Indemnification:** Client agrees to indemnify, defend, and protect the Consultant from and against all lawsuits and costs of every kind pertaining to the Client's business including reasonable legal fees due to any act or failure to act by the Client based upon the Consulting Services.

Consultant agrees to indemnify, defend, and protect the Client from and against all lawsuits and costs of every kind, including reasonable legal fees, that may result from Consultant's act(s) or failure(s) to act in furtherance of this Agreement. Consultant shall be personally liable for any damages that are attributable under the terms of this paragraph.

**10. No Modification Unless in Writing:** No modification of this Agreement shall be valid unless in writing and agreed upon by both Parties.



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EXHIBIT A  
SCOPE OF WORK

Consultant shall provide the following services:

- a. Consultant shall work no less than 60 (SIXTY) hours per 30-day period in the providing of services. Consultant shall document Consultant's work hours and provide Client with a written invoice indicating hours worked and a description of services provided during those hours.
- b. Create compelling stories in relation to the Town of Hempstead Animal Shelter and the animals being sheltered there in order to induce properly credentialed animal rescue groups to assist the Town in its efforts to adopt-out dogs and cats then-housed at the shelter. Such stories shall be presented to the Consultant Liaison for possible use by the Shelter including the Town of Hempstead website.
- c. Meetings and telephone conferences with rescue groups. Such meetings will be held off-site unless arrangements are made in advance through the Consultant Liaison.
- d. Recommend, through Consultant Liason, procedural changes designed to increase the release of animals to rescue groups.
- e. Work with cross-posters and sponsors to promote rescue group acceptance of shelter animals.
- f. Request, where appropriate, animal transport to rescue groups.
- g. Meet with Consultant Liaison, or his designee, no less than once every 30 days to review progress.
- h. Consultant shall exclusively contact the Consultant Liaison for any and all purposes related to Consultant's providing of services. For the purposes of this Agreement, or unless otherwise allowed by law, Consultant shall not, directly or indirectly, communicate with any other officials, employees, volunteers, or other service provider(s) unless otherwise authorized by this Agreement, the Consultant Liaison, or the Commissioner of General Services.
