15	doesn't seem to be enforced in Uniondale.

I move this Board adopting the finding statement in the Baldwin Mix-Use Overlay District.

I also wish to say that there are changes made to this Ordinance in the Summer of September, 2019 by the previous Supervisor and the previous Counsel person from the 5th District that removed density limits to the community, during the Fall, 2018 and Spring of 2019 and limits that the community was not expecting.

While these changes were put before the Board prior to the Public Hearing, these changes were not communicated to me who represents part of the Baldwin, not communicated to Councilman Anthony D'Esposito who also represents part of Baldwin and were not communicated to the civic association.

I wish we had time to address this problem and make the Ordinance more conforming to the wishes of the community prior to its adoption, but the timetable laid down by the State for our funding did not give us sufficient time.

1	However, I wanted to share with the
2	community that I, Supervisor Don Clavin,
3	Councilman Chris Carini and Councilman D'Esposito
4	will immediately begin working on the necessary $\overline{ ext{Page} 28}$
5	amendments that will return limits to this Overlay

9	And, I recommend adoption.

21	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: Second.
22	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: I have a couple of
23	slips, we will start with Felix Procacci.
24	If you can give your name and address.
25	FELIX PROCACCI: Felix Procacci. I am

1	speaking on Items numbered 50, 68 and 69 and they

1	It was in the 2020 budget originally.
2	And, so, I am asking does the Compliance
3	Officer's Department still exist?
4	Is that a way of getting rid of it? Just $Page \mid 32$
5	putting it I just don't know how to interpret
6	that.
7	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Mr. Sammon, did you
8	want to make an answer there.
9	HUMAN RESOURCE DIRECTOR SAMMON: Good
10	Morning, Supervisor, Members of the Town Board:
11	The Compliance Department is still in
12	operation.

8	done, all the retirements, the terminations,
9	salary increases, retirees and leave of absences
10	need to be put on the resolution right, now.

9	Good Morning, Ms. Madden. How are you?
10	DIANE MADDEN: Good Morning, how are you,
11	Supervisor?
12	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Good to see you.
13	DIANE MADDEN: Congratulations, again, and
14	Happy New Year.
15	Yes, it is 29 and, um, my question is did

1 The Purchasing Department is recommending 2 to the Town Board to renew the contract with Hills 3 Pet for dog and cat food for the year 2020. Page | 35 It is a requirements contract, I believe, 4 5 not to exceed twenty thousand dollars. DIANE MADDEN: The number one concerns I 6 7 have is that when you say, "the Purchasing 8 Department," there is no longer in my opinion the 9 person that was put in place after the first audit 10 to make sure that none of the food was recalled, 11 which, in this case, I believe, it has been 12 recalled a number of times and also that the RFP 13 goes out so that we get for these animals the 14 highest quality food for the lowest taxpayer 15 costs. 16 So, that is why I think it is really 17 imperative to put this out in an RFP and to 18 examine the food that the animals have been eating 19 and if, in fact, it has been recalled. 20 And, a lot of this information, um, comes 21 from caring employees inside that would like to 22 see things change particularly with some of these 23 contracts. 24 And, again, um, I think at this point I

12	I have never received any complaints from

2	this, um, but, I assure you the staff is concerned
3	about it and we should look into whether any of
4	that food is recalled because they have been fed $^{ m Page} 37$
5	Hills diet, which, again, I don't know.
6	I am not going to make a public statement
7	that it is their food, you know, they have had
8	many recalls and I know that we have purchased
9	Hills formula.
10	COUNCILMAN DUNNE: Permission, Supervisor?
11	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Yes.
12	COUNCILMAN DUNNE: Isn't there policies and
13	procedures that each of the departments in General
14	Services of something like this comes up, it is
15	addressed by the Department, it doesn't have to
16	come to the Board.
17	COMMISSIONER MARINO: Obviously, if
18	something is recalled
19	COUNCILMAN DUNNE: It seems like a no-
20	brainer.
21	COMMISSIONER MARINO: Right, that is
22	something that we would be contracted for or we
23	would look into any product that is recalled.
24	No one has ever brought it to our
25	attention.

1	I know Purchasing, before they renew a
2	contract, ask extensively the Department if there
3	is any reason why we shouldn't renew a contract
4	because we always use a one year with two-year $^{\mathrm{Page} 38}$
5	options, whatever.
6	We weren't told anything negative.
7	I never heard anything from an employee.
8	COUNCILMAN DUNNE: If something like this
9	does happen in that department or any department,
10	they will let you know and, then, you will let us
11	know, correct?
12	COMMISSIONER MARINO: Absolutely.
13	Remember, even though we have a contract, if we
14	deem in the middle of the contract that this
15	product is inferior or they are not doing the
16	right thing, we have the right to ask the Town
17	Board to revoke the contract and start over.

5	for certain animals.
6	DIANE MADDEN: Thank you.
7	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Thank you, Ms. Madden.
8	Thank you, Commissioner.
9	I don't have any other slips on this, would
10	anybody else like to be heard on the
11	Administrative Calendar?
12	Hello, how are you. Please, state your
13	name and address.
14	META MEREDAY: Meta J. Mereday, Baldwin
15	resident.
16	First and foremost, congratulations to the
17	new team, new leadership.
18	And, we are hoping for new energy, new
19	enthusiasm and actual results for those that

9	here to talk about Item Number 15 on the calendar?
10	META MEREDAY: I will continue on Item 21,
11	what is that?
12	I am just trying to understand where it
13	says, "act to amend the vehicle and traffic law in
14	relation to authorizing a residential parking
15	system in certain parts of the hamlet of
16	Oceanside."
17	TOWN ATTORNY RA: The Receiver called me
18	for a second.
19	You had a question on Item 15?
20	META MEREDAY: Yes.
21	TOWN ATTORNEY RA: Item 15 is an
22	environmental decision that says that the addition
23	to the auto repair shop will have no adverse
24	effect on the environment.
25	And, then, the application will, then

1	go forward and it will be the subject of a Town
2	Board Hearing.
3	META MEREDAY: Okay, there will be a
4	Hearing on that?
5	TOWN ATTORNEY RA: Yes.
6	I apologize, Supervisor.
7	META MEREDAY: 21, what is that?
8	COUNCILMAN D'ESPOSITO: 21, the act to
9	amend the vehicle and traffic law in Oceanside,
10	that one?
11	META MEREDAY: Yes.
12	COUNCILMAN D'ESPOSITO: So, what that is
13	about, there is a large expansion going on, on the
14	campus of South Nassau Hospital, so, for years,
15	there has been issues in the immediate vicinity
16	regarding parking.
17	Years back when, um, Councilman Hudes
18	recommended the NUMC area, um, there was an effort
19	put forward by the community and the Town of
20	Hempstead to have resident-only parking.
21	Basically, if you live on the street, you
22	get tags for your car.
23	This way, the people who are either working
24	at South Nassau, visiting South Nassau or doing
25	the construction at South Nassau aren't taking

1	up all the streets.
2	What that does require, it requires a Home
3	Rule Message which is a vote of legislation up in
4	Page 43
5	It is sent back down, here to us, the Town
6	of Hempstead. It goes back up to Albany.
7	So, what we are doing is we are telling our
8	representatives in Albany that we are willing to
9	look into this residential parking and try to come
10	up with an area to alleviate some of the issues
11	that the residents are having.
12	And, we are not sure, yet, if it is going
13	to be fore a longer duration or while the
14	construction is taking place.
15	META MEREDAY: I see, because parking is
16	problematic.
17	COUNCILMAN D'ESPOSITO: Yes.
18	META MEREDAY: I know it is a burden for
19	residents there, as well as those that live in
20	East Meadow, who are near the Medical Center.
21	COUNCILMAN D'ESPOSITO: Correct, yes.
22	META MEREDAY: Thank you.
23	COUNCILMAN D'ESPOSITO: You got it.
24	META MEREDAY: Pages 4, 5 and 6, have to do
25	with the extension of contracts, um, I

1	just wanted to get clarification as to what would
2	be taking place in terms of the procurement to
3	make sure that we have some diversity in these
4	contracts if we are extending established $Page \mid 44$
5	contracts?
6	How are we actually looking out for
7	increasing Veteran, Minority-owned and Women-owned
8	businesses?
9	Can someone speak to that?
10	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Town Attorney.
11	TOWN ATTORNEY RA: These are extension of
12	existing contracts as we may have said previously,
13	we complied with New York State Law and on
14	diversity contracts.
15	And, these are extensions of existing
16	contracts.
17	So, I don't know that there would have been
18	further reaching out on these extensions.
19	META MEREDAY: Okay, unfortunately, New
20	York State is failing in its own as far as
21	diversity.
22	So, being in compliance doesn't really bode
23	well because pretty much many of these contracts
24	are going to the same companies that really have
25	not proven that they have any diversity in place.

1	But, before my time is up, my last question
2	has to do with the hand-up that has to do with the
3	capital budget outlay, if someone can speak to
4	that?
5	TOWN ATTORNEY RA: That is a transfer of
6	funds.
7	It is not an increase, it is a transfer of

5	What this contract is for is any time the
6	Town does any type of demolition, we have an air
7	monitoring company come in to verify that asbestos
8	is under control, that it is not becoming
9	airborne.
10	So, in this case, Uniondale Avenue, yes.
11	PEARL JACOBS: That is included in this?
12	COMMISSIONER ROTTKAMP: Yes.
13	PEARL JACOBS: Can you also expound on what
14	is going on at 615 Uniondale Avenue?
15	At the last meeting, we were told, um, you
16	know, in '19, we were told that is, um, geared for
17	demolition.
18	However, we do see work being done at that
19	property, so, we do not understand.
20	Is it illegal work?
21	We do see someone has put in windows.
22	There is periodic, um, construction workers over

24	Um, I don't know. Like I said, it need to
25	be looked into because we want that demolished.

1	COMMISSIONER ROTTKAMP: The Town Board is
2	moving forward.
3	PEARL JACOBS: Moving forward with
4	demolishing it?
5	COMMISSIONER ROTTKAMP: Yes.
6	PEARL JACOBS: Is there an eye on that
7	property?
8	COMMISSIONER ROTTKAMP: Not that I am aware
9	of it.
10	PEARL JACOBS: Well, there needs to be an
11	eye on that property because we do see
12	periodically vans in front and they are doing some
13	sort of work.
14	COMMISSIONER ROTTKAMP: I will have an area

17	Another question, 876 Uniondale Avenue, the
18	old, um, former oil and lube station, we do see
19	they are going underground doing work.
20	There is work at that location.
21	Can you tell us what is going on there?
22	COMMISSIONER ROTTKAMP: Well, I know the
23	one gas station, um, is going to become a 7-
24	Eleven.
25	PEARL JACOBS: That is across

1	from the Walgreens.

3	piece of property.
