| 9  | This is a complete raze and remove.                         |
| 10 | In fact, with me, today, is Chris Tartaglia                 |
| 11 | from High Point Engineering, the Civil Engineers            |
| 12 | that prepared the plans that are in front of you            |

I am also concerned about people coming onto our property or blocking our property or blocking our egress and ingress, um, to run into Bolla Market to use the bathroom, get cigarettes, a cup of coffee, whatever it maybe.

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And, one important very, very important point, I want to mention and I am glad Gray Page | 58 brought this up, if you notice on our site plan, I would presume that currently, today, backing out of those driveways, as long as the tenants move their cars that are in front of this auto shop, the other cars that are marked along that street, again, they are not in conjunction with the current use of our property because our property has been closed for some time.

It is not operational.

So, I presume that those cars maybe used in conjunction with Gary's tenant operation.

Now, I just would like to inform Gary that based on DPW commentary, we are mandated to install "no parking" signs along our entire property frontage.

So, I think with that, um, that might create a bit of an issue for Gary's tenants.

But, I think it will clear up a safety issue because parked cars will block visibility of people trying to back out of driveways just as much as our building would, so, I think we are actually making the situation significantly

better in terms of a safety prospective.

As to who owns the cars and why they are parked on the street, again, I don't now if they are in affiliation with that building, but, certainly, um, a business that has a lot of vehicles associated with it and allowing almost no on-site parking, um, does not really appear to be a problem that Bolla can or should have to fix.

GARY AIN: I would like to respond to that.

Um, first, by saying I wasn't aware that you were going to have "no parking" um, out in front of the whole site, um, that is even more of a problem because that takes away more parking from the area.

There is already very little of street parking over there.

There is no side streets anywhere for anybody to park, um, in addition having a car parked in the street is much different than having a building height, um, you know, a big building block all the way out by the curb or close to the street, let's just say, um, that is completely blocking any and all visibility from anybody pulling out.
