2	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Good Afternoon.
3	FELIX PROCACCI: How much is the 2022
4	budget total projected expenditures and total $^{ m Page} 7$
5	projected revenues?
6	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: The projected
7	expenditures are 500.3 million dollars and the
8	revenues equal 500.3 million dollars.
9	FELIX PROCACCI: How much reserves are
10	being used in the 2022 budget?
11	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Approximately,
12	twenty million.
13	FELIX PROCACCI: Twenty million.
14	How much was the 2022 budget cut from 2021
15	levels?
16	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: The budget is an
17	increase over the prior, it is under the inflation
18	rate.
19	It is up, approximately, four percent.
20	FELIX PROCACCI: Four percent.
21	How much was the 2022 salary amount cut
22	from 2021 levels?
23	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: It depends on
24	which salaries you are talking about.
25	FELIX PROCACCI: Total salaries of



1	the entire Town?
2	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: It depends on
3	which particular salaries you are talking about.
4	Um, there was certain groups, they were $^{ m Page} 8$
5	less than last year.
6	Um, there was a Union contract that was
7	signed prior to the completion of this budget that
8	is included in here but the salaries go from 171.3
9	to 180.4.
10	FELIX PROCACCI: That is the total?
11	When I summed it up, I got 5.37 percent
12	increase or nine million dollar increase Town
13	wide.
14	When you look at everything, that is the
15	question, is everything if you include all the
16	Departments, everything?
17	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Right.
18	FELIX PROCACCI: The level I get and I just
19	want to compare what you get, I trust your numbers
20	more.
21	I got 9.15 million increase over 2021.
22	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: We have it at
23	9.1.
24	FELIX PROCACCI: Okay and I also, if you go
25	by way of the 2019 actual salaries,



1	the actual number which is provided in this
2	budget, I got a 14.8 per cent increase or twenty-
3	three million dollar increase.
4	Would you say that is correct? $Page \mid 9$
5	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: I can't verify
6	that.
7	Where are you getting your numbers?
8	FELIX PROCACCI: I totaled the 2019 actuals
9	from what you put in this year's 2022 budget.
10	I summed them all up and I compared them to
11	what you are budgeting in 2022.
12	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Right.
13	FELIX PROCACCI: And, I took the difference
14	and the difference I get is twenty-three million
15	or 5.8 percent difference.
16	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: That is over a
17	three-year period.
18	FELIX PROCACCI: Yes, so, you would say
19	that is accurate?
20	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: '19, 2021, '22,
21	actually, it is a four-year period.
22	FELIX PROCACCI: That is right.
23	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: There is a Union
24	contract.
25	There is



FELIX PROCACCI: You agree with the number?
COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Unless I sit
down and figure it out, I will accept what you
Page 10
FELIX PROCACCI: Okay.
How much Federal CARES Act money is added
to the Town Reserves?
COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: For this year?
Nothing.
FELIX PROCACCI: For both years, 2020 and
2021?
COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: As per Town
Board Resolution, there was, um, seventy million.
FELIX PROCACCI: Seventy million added to
the Reserves?
COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Right.
FELIX PROCACCI: How much Federal CARES Act
money remains unspent?
COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Fifty-four
thousand dollars.
FELIX PROCACCI: Fifty-four thousand
dollars, the miscellaneous revenue is up fifty
million dollars in 2020 was that due to Federal
CARES Act money?
COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: There is no



1	Federal Cares Act money in this budget.
2	FELIX PROCACCI: No, I am saying in 2020?
3	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Probably
4	referencing Page 11
5	FELIX PROCACCI: You're referencing 2020 in
6	this budget.
7	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: The Emergency
8	Rental Assistance Program, we have expenditures in
9	the budget for that and it is offset by revenue in
10	the budget.
11	FELIX PROCACCI: What you classify in this
12	budget for 2020 as "miscellaneous," what is that?
13	Is that the rental revenue?
14	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Yes, it is
15	primarily the rental revenue, yes.
16	FELIX PROCACCI: Has the audit for 2020
17	been completed yet?
18	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: No.
19	FELIX PROCACCI: When will that be
20	completed?
21	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: I can't tell you
22	for sure.
23	The auditors had their issues with, um, you
24	know, with the, um, the issue of the virus.
25	They weren't here until late in the



1	period.
2	I can't answer that.
3	I don't work for them and they don't tell
4	me when they are going to be finished.
5	FELIX PROCACCI: I know, that was the
6	reason that was given last year.
7	And, North Hempstead, though, had their
8	audit completed in July, ahead of like the number
9	$30^{ m th}$ deadline and what I find interesting is Rating
10	Agencies usually, from my experience, they usually
11	wait until the audited numbers come out before
12	they make a determination this year and I believe
13	and even last year, they preempted the audit.
14	They gave a rating decision before seeing
15	the
16	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: John, were there two
17	rating upgrades?
18	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Yes.
19	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Good job, by the way.
20	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Thank you.
21	What they do, they take what your
22	projections have been in the past, they take what
23	you have submitted to the State Comptroller with
24	the annual updated documents and then they compare
25	it to when the audit is completed.

1	And, if they find that you are accurate
2	within, you know, a certain amount, um, they will
3	continue to use your estimates and that is exactly
4	what has happened for the two upgrades that we $^{ m Page} 13$
5	just received.
6	They looked at our projections.
7	They looked at what we filed with the State
8	Comptroller.
9	They compared it to the prior year's
10	estimates and the prior year's audit and they
11	found that our numbers are great and they use them
12	and it has happened with both Rating Agencies.
13	FELIX PROCACCI: I understand that but in
14	the past years, usually, they wait until after
15	September 30^{th} , after the audit was completed
16	before they made
17	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: A bond issue was
18	coming up and we need to be rated by both Moody's
19	and Standard and Poor's.
20	FELIX PROCACCI: I notice there was a
21	difference between your August your April
22	numbers from Federal numbers was fifty-seven
23	million and then in the budget you put fifty
24	million dollars for Federal expenditures,



revenues.

1	So, anyway, thank you.
2	(Whereupon, the three-minute bell rang.
3	After, the following ensued.)
4	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Thank you, Mr.
5	Procacci.
6	I appreciate you recognizing those bond
7	upgrades.
8	Good work, John.
9	Next slip I have here is for Bonnie Garone.
10	Good Afternoon, name and address for the
11	record. Thank you.
12	BONNIE GARONE: Bonnie Garone, Rockville
13	Centre.
14	I think this preliminary budget perfectly
15	optimizes the way this Town is run.
16	It tells a story to the public upfront in
17	the introduction to make it sound like you are
18	-
	doing a terrific job.
19	Um, it is set up to provide jobs for your
20	cronies no matter how much it costs the residents,
21	it, um, does all you can possibly do to hide what
22	you are doing from the public.
23	And, um, I will give you examples of each
24	of those.
25	In your introduction, you say that the



1	"Town of Hempstead provides the lion share of
2	local services providing public education and
3	police protection."
4	Well, that is not true. Page \mid 15
5	I mean you provide a lot of Parks and
6	Recreation.
7	Some parts of the Town are more favored
8	than those things than others.
9	You pick up some garbage.
10	You supply water even though you haven't
11	really helped the residents that are trying to get
12	out from under their exorbitantly expensive
13	private water.
14	You are responsible for the roads, which
15	most residents will tell you are in horrendous
16	shape.
17	You got the Building Department, which is
18	pretty much the same thing and the Animal Shelter
19	which is the subject of complaints and horror
20	stories for years.
21	So, um, as far as providing making sure you
22	can provide jobs to your cronies.
23	You have a Civil Service Commission with
24	personnel costs over a million dollars when you
25	could simply utilize the Nassau County



1	Civil Service Commission and eliminate those costs
2	completely, but you don't.
3	And, I wonder why.
4	$_{ m You\ have\ your\in\ terms\ of\ hiding\ things}^{ m Page} 16$
5	in this budget, just one example, you have all of
6	your public relations staff hidden in General
7	Services on Page 82, not perfectly identified as
8	such, but this they are.
9	And, as far as, um, appropriations in the
10	2021 budget, you had, "other" category, a five
11	hundred thousand dollars.
12	In this Preliminary Budget, you have "other
13	unspecified appropriations," of twenty-seven
14	million three hundred and fifty thousand five
15	hundred and fifty-four dollars that is twenty-
16	seven million of "other."
17	And, you don't tell the residents what
18	those are.
19	So, you know we all know that most
20	residents don't have the time to go through and
21	analyze or even read a two hundred and seven page
22	Preliminary Budget.
23	You know that and that is why you put it
24	together this way.
25	So, if there is a Newsday reporter



1	listening, you never write about the Town but this
2	is a public service, you need to tell people what
3	is hidden in this budget because most people are
4	not going to know and you should be ashamed of $^{ m Page} 17$
5	yourself.
6	(Whereupon, the three-minute bell rang.

23	CLERK MURRAY: Councilman D'Esposito?
24	COUNCILMAN D'ESPOSITO: Aye.
25	CLERK MURRAY: Councilman Dunne?



1	COUNCILMAN DUNNE: Aye.
2	CLERK MURRAY: Senior Councilwoman Goosby?
3	SENIOR COUNCILWOMAN GOOSBY: Aye.
4	CLERK MURRAY: Councilman Muscarella? Page 8
5	COUNCILMAN MUSCARELLA: Aye.
6	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Madam Clerk, please,
7	call the next Public Hearing.
8	CLERK MURRAY: Preliminary Budget for the
9	Town of Hempstead for the fiscal year beginning
10	January 1, 2022.
11	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: I have a couple of
12	slips on this that would like to be heard.
13	First, we will start with Stuart Kroll.
14	Good Evening, Mr. Kroll, if you would give
15	your name and address for the record.
16	STUART KROLL: Stuart Kroll, Great Neck.
17	I just have a couple of questions, comments
18	regarding the Animal Shelter budget.
19	The first item that caught my attention was
20	the budgeted amount of one hundred thousand
21	dollars for legal expenses at the Shelter.
22	It strikes me as an unusually large legal
23	expense for a Shelter.
24	We did have somebody that was not
25	qualified, didn't have the proper credentials



1	and a dog with aggressive history ended up maiming
2	somebody, basically causing severe damage.
3	I would like to know why this budget is so
4	high if people are working. $\overline{Page \mid 9}$
5	There are negligent people no matter what
6	they do, if they are negligent and don't have the
7	right qualifications, shouldn't that be their
8	expense rather than the Town's expense?
9	So, if anybody cares to answer that, feel
10	free to do so.
11	I guess not.
12	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: May I respond to
13	you.
14	STUART KROLL: Sure.
15	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: We don't create
16	lawsuits.
17	We are responding to the lawsuits that are
18	served on the Town of Hempstead and that is an
19	expensive proposition and that is legal fees.
20	It is Court fees and that is what it is.
21	It is an estimate based upon prior years,
22	experience and the number of lawsuits that are
23	generated.
24	We don't generate the lawsuits.
25	We have to defend ourselves.



1	STUART KROLL: You don't generate the
2	lawsuits but my question is if somebody is put in
3	a position of authority and working with animals
4	$\stackrel{ extstyle{ extstyle{Page}} 10}{ extstyle{ extstyle{Where people are involved and if there is anything}}$
5	against or lack of the proper credentials causes
6	the problem, causes a lawsuit should the Town be
7	responsible?
8	Should they personally be responsible?
9	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: That is your
10	judgment. It is not anything that we can do if we
11	are served, we have to respond.
12	STUART KROLL: The Town is responsible, I
13	understand.
14	Okay, there is an expenditure, also of ten
15	thousand dollars for advertising and promotion.
16	I hope, of course, is not spent in one
17	place, social media, promotion of the animals is
18	minimal.
19	How can we find good homes for the many
20	deserving dogs and cats with so little money?
21	The Shelter has recently dealt with and
22	still dealing with a large-scale hoarding
23	situation.
24	What is to happen with these cats?
25	Are they going to be sent to the



1	Good Shepard with money that wasn't intended for
2	such a purpose.
3	There is also a line item of twenty-seven
4	thousand dollars for placement of animals. $ \begin{array}{c} \text{Page} \mid 11 \\ \end{array} $
5	I would like to know what that means.
6	Does that actually mean placement of
7	animals?
8	What are they actually doing to promote
9	these animals?
10	If anybody cares to respond to that, would
11	be nice.
12	Every possible effort should be made to
13	socialize any animal that needs it and utilize
14	every means available to find them a good home.
15	We have been told that the Shelter is short
16	staffed, how is that possible with a payroll of
17	our four million dollars which is budgeted for the
18	next fiscal year?
19	Perhaps someone would care to tell me how
20	many fulltime employees working there, as well as
21	the number of part-time employees?
22	Is that information readily available?
23	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: It is in the
24	budget.
25	STUART KROLL: Okay, those employees are,



1	Obviously, very well compensated.
2	Part of the problem is that any Department
3	would have to have employees working there,
4	hopefully, very devoted working with them rather ${}^{\mbox{\sc Page} 12}$
5	than just Civil Service Employees, who by happen
6	stance end up working at the Shelter.
7	No doubt many of them do care deeply, when
8	you have those in charged with the least qualified
9	and lie about their credentials and obscure the
10	real purpose of working with animals.
11	Maybe, perhaps, you can tell me how medical
12	costs went down fifteen thousand dollars from one
13	hundred and forty thousand dollars to one hundred
14	and twenty-five thousand dollars?
15	The Shelter has been dealing with numerous
16	cats hoarding situations, how is it possible that
17	there is less medical supplies needed than their
18	previously were?
19	(Whereupon, the three-minute bell rang.
20	After, the following ensued.)
21	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Thank you, Mr. Kroll.
22	We appreciate you always visiting the Town
23	of Hempstead.
24	Next, I have Diane Madden.
25	Good evening, give your name and address



1	for the record.
2	DIANE MADDEN: Diane Madden.
3	How much of the Federal CARES Act money,
4	the COVID Relief Funds were used to balance your $^{ m Page} 13$
5	2021 budget?
6	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Nothing.
7	DIANE MADDEN: How much of the COVID Relief
8	Funds were used to balance your 2022 budget?
9	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO; Nothing, zero.
10	DIANE MADDEN: So, you can't identify in
11	this budget any COVID money whatsoever?
12	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: There is money
13	in this budget for emergency rental assistance.
14	Um, there is a budgeted, estimate as to
15	what we anticipate will be spent in 2022 and it is
16	offset by the Gant from the, um, Treasury for that
17	purpose, that is the only thing that is in, here.
18	DIANE MADDEN: Why is that money still in
19	there?
20	I mean, there was a protest the other day,
21	why is that money still there and not given to the
22	vendors?
23	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: The money goes
24	through a process, most of it, I would say,
25	eighty, ninety percent of it has



1	been obligated or paid out at this point in time
2	and it is a three-year program.
3	DIANE MADDEN: So, where is all the COVID
4	money? Page 14
5	How do you identify that?
6	Is it comingled?
7	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Every single
8	draw down of the COVID funding, as we have said,
9	many, many times was done via Town Board
10	Resolution.
11	DIANE MADDEN: I didn't ask that.
12	I am asking where is the money?
13	You're saying it is not in this budget?
14	I think by your own admission, today, you
15	said seventy million was in this budget.
16	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: I did not say
17	that.
18	DIANE MADDEN: So, where is the COVID money
19	if it is not in this budget?
20	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: The COVID money
21	in prior year and, it is our rainy day fund.
22	DIANE MADDEN: How much is left?
23	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Of the seventy
24	million?
25	DIANE MADDEN: Right.



1	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: We had two
2	years, we utilized twenty million, approximately,
3	thirty.
4	DIANE MADDEN: Where did it go?
5	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: I just said it
6	is in our fund balance, it is in our rainy day
7	fund.
8	DIANE MADDEN: So isn't the rainy day fund
9	apart of the budget?
10	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: The rainy day
11	fund is not part of the budget.
12	DIANE MADDEN: So you have the COVID money,
13	so, I understand this, so everyone understands
14	this, in a totally separate, isolated account?
15	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: The money was
16	drawn down.
17	DIANE MADDEN: It is just yes or no, is it
18	in a separate account?
19	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Ms. Madden, please, be
20	respectful.
21	DIANE MADDEN: I am being respectful. He
22	is dancing around every question, every question I
23	asked.
24	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: He is answering all the
25	questions.



	HEMPSTEAD TOWN BOARD 10/20/2021 7:00 p.m.
1	DIANE MADDEN: I disagree.
2	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Okay.
3	DIANE MADDEN: The answer is yes or no.
4	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: You don't set the Page 16
5	guidelines on the answer.
6	Mr. Mastromarino can explain, which he did.
7	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: The money was in
8	a segregated account and according to our system
9	that we set up was drawn from that account into
10	our General Fund when the Town Board passed a
11	Resolution, so, it is in our General Fund.
12	DIANE MADDEN: Exactly, how much is left?
13	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Do you any questions
14	regarding this budget?
15	DIANE MADDEN: That is part of this budget.
16	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Approximately,
17	thirty million of the seventy.
18	DIANE MADDEN: Here is my proposal, that
19	you table this budget until everyone can identify
20	where this money is.
21	I don't understand how you could pass a
22	budget like this with a clear conscience when I
23	can't get a really straight answer as to where the
24	COVID fund are and why you even still have COVID
25	funds left.



1	What happens if the Federal Government
2	calls back this money?
3	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: It gets returned
4	to the Treasurer. Page 17
5	DIANE MADDEN: Excuse me?
6	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: It gets returned
7	to the Treasurer.
8	DIANE MADDEN: Not if you spent it on
9	salaries and promotions and raises.
10	I think we would have a tax increase in
11	that case.
12	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: No, the process
13	we went through was carefully vetted.
14	It complied with every single step that was
15	issued by the Federal Treasury.
16	DIANE MADDEN: And, if that were true,
17	Supervisor Clavin would be at every single debate
18	that is out there, now, against Jason Abelove, so,
19	something is not adding up.

11	Johnathan Prevost. I have a question with regards
12	to the Parks budget for the updating the Parks,
13	that line item in the budget, I was reviewing to
14	see if the thirty thousand dollars allocated to
15	Coes Neck is in this budget?
16	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Coes Neck Park?
17	JOHNATHAN PREVOST: Coes Neck Park, sir, is
18	the Town of Hempstead.
19	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: Part of the Town
20	of Hempstead Park.
21	JOHNATHAN PREVOST: Have Meetings been
22	conducted with the communities that show what they
23	would like or is it just, you know a blanket job?
24	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: We have to defer
25	I don't know.



1	JOHNATHAN PREVOST: So, would it be
2	possible with the Civic Association and Supervisor
3	Clavin and Senior Councilwoman Goosby to discuss
4	this?
5	PARKS COMMISSIONER: I know we have two
6	capital projects in the calendar year but as far
7	as improvements within the Operating Budget, I
8	don't believe that is there.
9	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Okay.
10	JOHNATHAN PREVOST: All right, I will talk
11	to you on the side.
12	Thank you, Town Board, I appreciate you.
13	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Stick around, he will
14	talk to you in the back room if you want to
15	follow-up.
16	JOHNATHAN PREVOST: Okay, for the bathrooms
17	at Coes Neck Park location, is it possible COVID
18	funds could be allocated for the bathrooms?
19	They are in desperate need of repair.
20	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: You will talk to him.
21	Follow-up on that.
22	PARKS COMMISSIONER: Absolutely.
23	JOHNATHAN PREVOST: My last minute and
24	eight seconds, I just want to point out that there
25	are several lights in Coes Neck that need to



1	be repaired because we have children practicing in
2	the Park.
3	It is an issue as a taxpayer.
4	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Okay, great. Page \mid 20
5	Please go in the back and take it down and
6	follow-up.
7	Thank you for bringing it to our attention.
8	Appreciate it.
9	Next, I have Laura Wiggins.
10	Good Evening, if you could give your name
11	and address for the record, please.
12	LAURA WIGGINS: Laura Wiggins, Uniondale,
13	New York.
14	I wish to ask the Town in reference to
15	Uniondale Public Library to review the tentative
16	budget for 2022.
17	The community cannot ask questions of the
18	Board.
19	There are five Members of the Board which
20	compiles and submits the budget to you for
21	approval.
22	There is, for example, account, 10/10
23	salaries.
24	Everyone is grouped, administration,
25	clerks, everyone, to the tune of almost



1	two million dollars.
2	Now, Uniondale has been without a Director
3	for a number of years.
4	Our Director is new.
5	Our Assistant Director is quite new. We do
6	not know who is getting what.
7	But, we do know that financial positions
8	have been created.
9	We know that people have been promoted and,
10	of course salaries increased, yet, they sit on
11	four million dollars in a structure that cannot
12	accommodate or serve the community.
13	And, they have been doing this for a few
14	years.
15	The question is this budget with COVID
16	affecting us as it has, four million dollars, I
17	think is a little high, too high because they have
18	done nothing in the past three years, let alone,
19	ten years.
20	Suggestions have been made in regard to
21	where they may possibly purchase land to build a
22	structure and they have failed to follow through
23	on any suggestions.
24	For that reason and others, I am asking you
25	to review this budget because the five persons

1	who formulated this budget and I am not going to
2	publicly name names.
3	They are incompetent, especially one who is
4	the President at the time. Page \mid 22
5	He cannot conduct a Meeting. Thank you.
6	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Thank you, Mrs.
7	Wiggins.
8	John, you will take that under advisement
9	when you receive the budget.
10	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: As part of the
11	process, we interview every Special District,
12	every Library District that is within the Town.
13	There are addendums to the budget.
14	The law says we have to publish their
15	budget.
16	The budget is generated by the individual
17	members of their legislative body, hopefully, at
18	the Hearing that they have.
19	Our responsibility is to look at the
20	expenses and to ask the questions and see if they
21	appear to be proper.
22	We have done that with this Library.
23	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Thank you, Mrs.
24	Wiggins.
25	LAURA WIGGINS: I have a question.



1	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: You are at the three-
2	minute mark.
3	If you stick around after, we are always
4	happy to talk to you.
5	Thank you.
6	Next, I have Ms. Mereday.
7	Good Evening, name and address for the
8	record, please.
9	META MEREDAY: Meta Mereday, taxpayer.
10	Um, um, I am hoping when I ask a question
11	that the time is stopped and it allows for whoever
12	that is paid to do this work, since I didn't have
13	the time to actually go through all of this today
14	because some of us kind of out, here, are trying
15	to actually save lives or keep people employed to
16	pay these high taxes.
17	I have a question, the only thing I can see
18	related to any Veteran-type services was "Veteran
19	Meeting Rooms," for fifteen hundred dollars.
20	Is there any change or increase or, you
21	know, epitome with regard to increasing Veteran
22	related services and outreach in this upcoming
23	budget?
24	Please, stop the clock at two minutes.
25	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: That fifteen



1	hundred is actually set by State Law.
2	META MEREDAY: I am glad we follow the
3	State and Federal regulations for something.
4	$\overline{Page} 24$ But, I am looking for what else is in this
5	budget that is going to address the needs of our
6	over forty thousand Veterans.
7	Again, please, stop the clock so they can
8	look to the answer to the question.
9	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Ms. Mereday, she is
10	doing a great job with the clock.
11	META MEREDAY: I didn't name names.
12	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: She is doing her job.
13	META MEREDAY: Time is up. Everybody is
14	doing a great job and again, the clock is ticking
15	and I have not gotten an answer to the question.
16	COMPTROLLER MASTROMARINO: We do have a
17	number of, um, Veteran groups that is on the Town
18	as an expense and if there is anything that is of
19	a particular need for any Veteran organization or
20	needs of anything, um, that will be addressed
21	during the year.
22	META MEREDAY: It is not addressed during
23	the year, sir.
24	I am, here, during the year. I am out on
25	the streets addressing the needs of Veterans



1	that are not being addressed by my tax dollars.
2	So, I am asking, is the answer to the
3	question, more of the same?
4	Is that the answer to the question? Page \mid 25
5	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: No, it is not, Mrs.
6	Mereday.
7	We actually use our Department at DOORS
8	which is run by Mr. Mollet, that actually works
9	with the Veteran Groups on a regular basis.
10	In addition to that, we have a great team,
11	here with the Veterans that have a beautiful
12	office on the second floor where they are dealing
13	with the Vets on a regular basis.
14	They do a tremendous job.
15	We are proud of them.
16	We use the funds also coming from DOOR to
17	assist in programs.
18	META MEREDAY: And, again, where is the
19	report for that?
20	Could that, possibly, be put out instead of
21	all the inundation of campaign materials that is
22	really irrelevant because you are only getting
23	elected, at this stage of the game, it really
24	doesn't matter which Party gets elected because it
25	is the taxpayers that continue to get screwed.

1	I know you want to do this campaign
2	promise.
3	Everybody is great. Everyone is doing a
4	wonderful job and in most cases they are but you $^{ m Page} 26$
5	still have not answered the question with regard
6	to an actual increase in the resources that needs
7	to bring on great bodies to do the work, to meet
8	the increasing needs of our Veterans, particularly
9	following the pandemic, that is my question.
10	The other question is since there are State
11	regulations that pertain to the participation of
12	minority, women and Veteran businesses, Veteran
13	businesses generally hire Veterans but if we are
14	not bringing in our procuring contracts with
15	Veteran-owned businesses, we can't provide those

24	County-owned road.
25	META MEREDAY: I know it is a County-



1	owned road.
2	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: We don't have any other
3	slips from people that wanted to speak here,
4	tonight, is there anybody in the audience that $^{ m Page} 29$
5	would like to be heard that hasn't spoken already?
6	(Whereupon, no response was heard. After,
7	the following ensued.)
8	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Okay if not, may I,
9	please, have a Motion.
10	SENIOR COUNCILWOMAN GOOSBY: Supervisor, I
11	move to adopt the Preliminary budget as the Annual
12	Budget for the Town of Hempstead for the fiscal
13	year beginning January 1, 2022.
14	COUNCILMAN BLAKEMAN: I proudly second
15	that.
16	CLERK MURRAY: Supervisor Clavin?
17	SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Aye.

21	COUNCILMAN CARINI: Aye.
