I can't speak for the roads in Oceanside but many of the Town roads in locations like Elmont and Roosevelt, where I used to live are in deplorable conditions.

So, I am just trying to understand how, um, this is going to be implemented.

I know in some locations where you have handicapped parking, there is also blue lines for people to be able to better understand that space is for handicapped but if the roads are torn up, in most cases lighting is bad on many of the Town streets in those communities, what is being done to address the overall safety, not just providing potential parking?

The cemetery covers about ninety-seven percent of the cemetery costs.

A large majority of the customers that we see will actually get a reduction in the next year or so.

FELIX PROCACCI: I think the fees should cover the cost of the cemetery.

Um, Item Number 30, 32 and 36, each of them reference additional documents, reports and those aren't provided.

I can't find them. Are they there?
SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Which ones, again?
FELIX PROCACCI: 32, 33 AND 36.

TOWN ATTORNEY MACCARONE: With regard to 32, that settlement, actually, we got the final paperwork on it, I believe, yesterday.

So, it was put on the calendar.
It involves a person - - the Supervisor is instructed to be more proactive in resolving matters and not having to spend too much time and money on legal fees and litigation.

So, this gentleman brought a Claim to us.
He was working out of Title at the Animal Shelter and after we reviewed it, we found that it was valid, so, we settled.

Basically, we also settled for no money.
All we did with regard to Mr. Minto, we put him in the proper category.

He got a small raise as a result.
(Whereupon, applause from the audience was heard. After, the following ensued.)

AMIL VIRANI: But, um, you said at one of the Redistricting Hearings that this is a "work in progress," so, shouldn't you plan on the mapmakers being there?

There is a lot of money being paid for these mapmakers to put together a map.

TOWN ATTORNEY MACCARONE: To be honest with you, just reviewing the Town records from ten years ago, no mapmakers showed and testified and that map was highly challenged and found to be okay.

So, we will comply with the law.
There is no requirement that the mapmakers be there, quite frankly.

Even though hundreds of your constituents pleaded with the Redistricting Commission not to dilute their voices by putting minority communities with districts that have nothing in common, the Commission ignored their requests and Motions that the Commission only considered population variations and to keep communities whole.

No mention was made to consider the mandate that if a Majority/Minority District can be drawn, it must be drawn.

Violation is established if a political
