your name and address for the record, thank you.

1 PEARL JACOBS: Pearl Jacobs, Uniondale.

2 Item 6, Uniondale, I would like to know
3 the, um, address of this location, of this home?

4 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Okay.

5 PEARL JACOBS: - - Or this building.

6 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Just identify yourself,
7 that would be great.

8 DEPUTY COMMISSIONER LEO: Good Morning,
9 Supervisor, Members of the Board, Dan Leo, Deputy
10 Commissioner of the Building Department.

11 Can you repeat the question, please?

12 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Item Number 6, she is
13 looking for the address of the property in
14 Uniondale.

15 DEPUTY COMMISSIONER LEO: Well, we have
16 several.

17 PEARL JACOBS: Uniondale, it says Item 6,
18 right?

19 DEPUTY COMMISSIONER LEO: Item 6, we have
20 several.

21 Are you referring to 581 Emerson in
22 Uniondale.

23 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: She is looking for the
24 address.

25 PEARL JACOBS: Give me the addresses

1 or properties, please and thank you.

2 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: John, you have it?

3 DEPUTY COMMISSIONER LEO: 581 Emerson.

4 We have 897 Front Street, which was an
5 issue of graffiti, which was taken care of and
6 1065 Front Street in Uniondale, which was an open
7 and abandoned, a car had gone into the building.

8 And, on the first one 581 Emerson, there
9 was a hole in the front yard which was taken care
10 of, an inground pool which was removed.

11 PEARL JACOBS: Okay and, um, we do have an
12 issue, I know I have spoken with Buildings about
13 this, 576 Uniondale Avenue, it is a blighted - -

14 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Is that on the
15 Administrative Calendar?

16 PEARL JACOBS: Oh, no, 576, I wish the
17 signage would be removed from that location.

18 Item Number 16, um, ratifying and
19 confirming the purchase of event cancellation,
20 rain insurance for the Town of Hempstead, "Salute
21 to Veterans" concert and fireworks display on July
22 1st.

23 Now, I was here in June and I spoke
24 regarding the outrageous use and I don't call them
25 fireworks.

1 I call them explosives in the Town of
2 Hempstead and Nassau County.

3 Now, this "Salute to Veterans" this is so
4 hypocritical to me because you are saluting
5 Veterans with fireworks and explosives that go on
6 for six months out of the year, here, in the Town
7 of Hempstead.

8 Veterans that have fought and sacrificed
9 their lives for our Country - - um, I will wait
10 until you finish.

11 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: No, you can keep going,
12 we are listening to you.

13 PEARL JACOBS: I don't like the disrespect.

14 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: No disrespect at all,
15 but that is okay.

16 PEARK JACOBS: Veterans that have lost
17 their lives for our Country come back to their
18 homeland and they have to listen to these
19 explosive fireworks that permeate our communities.

20 I see you, Supervisor Clavin on shark
21 patrol at the beaches and that is fine.

22 Okay, but, people choose to swim in the
23 waters with sharks, okay and I do not want anyone
24 to get hurt.

25 You have the drones.

1 You are looking for the sharks, that is
2 good.

3 You are trying to help the people enjoy
4 their Summer.

5 Why don't you help the people enjoy their
6 Summer who pay their taxes, the residents who pay
7 these high taxes in Uniondale who can't - - not
8 even in Uniondale, across the Town of Hempstead,
9 across Nassau County who pay these high taxes, the
10 third highest taxes in the Nation, who can't enjoy
11 their backyards, who can't enjoy their Summers
12 because they are listening to these explosive
13 fireworks the whole time?

14 Okay, the whole Summer they cannot enjoy.

15 They start in May and they go through
16 October.

17 So, almost a six-month timeframe that these
18 explosive fireworks that are shot off in our
19 communities and our Veterans, our animals, our
20 dogs and cats, who, you know, they suffer from the
21 fear of these loud noises and explosives, our
22 elderly, our people with heart conditions, our
23 Veterans, you need to do something about these
24 fireworks.

25 And, our police are doing what they are

1 supposed to do but they need stronger laws.

2 They need laws with teeth.

3 (Whereupon, the three-minute bell rang.

4 After, the following ensued.)

5 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Thank you, Ms. Jacobs.

6 Just so you know, most residents choose not
7 to swim with sharks.

8 This is, Number 16, is in relation to the
9 fireworks shows that was presented to the
10 Veterans where people did not have a mandatory
11 attendance.

12 They could voluntarily come down and I am
13 happy to report and great work to our Parks
14 Commissioner, we had ten thousand people that came
15 down to enjoy, not only the fireworks, they
16 enjoyed a concert of K.C. and the Sunshine Band.

17 It was a fun time by all.

18 Councilman Muscarella was there very late
19 and we appreciate it.

20 And, next, I am going to call up Felix
21 Procacci.

22 Hi, Mr. Procacci, if you would give your
23 name and address for the record, thank you.

24 FELIX PROCACCI: Felix Procacci, Franklin
25 Square.

1 Items 14, 15, 34 and 35, all reference
2 agreements, I didn't see any agreements in the
3 resolutions.

4 Um, are there written agreements for these ^{Page | 16}
5 resolutions?

6 And, did they or will they be signed by the
7 Parks Commissioner?

8 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Mr. Town Attorney, are
9 there written agreements?

10 TOWN ATTORNEY MACCARONE: There are written
11 agreements that will be signed by the Parks
12 Commissioner.

13 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Okay, thank you.

14 FELIX PROCACCI: Where are these written
15 agreements?

16 Why aren't they in the Resolution?

17 TOWN ATTORNEY MACCARONE: I believe there
18 was.

19 There should have been some of them up
20 there.

21 And, Mr. Procacci, if you ask my office, we
22 will provide them to you.

23 I see Commissioner Zangler, here, he will
24 get me those documents and we will get them to
25 you.

1 FELIX PROCACCI: I don't want you to say I
2 FOIL too much when this should be part of the
3 documents.

4 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: I don't think he said ^{Page | 17}
5 anything about FOIL-ing, now.

6 I think he said he will get you the
7 documents.

8 FELIX PROCACCI: I understand that.

9 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: You brought up FOIL-
10 ing. I don't what one has to do with the other.

11 FELIX PROCACCI: Don, please.

12 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Mr. Procacci - -

13 FELIX PROCACCI: You are getting
14 ridiculous.

15 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Mr. Procacci, you asked
16 about agreements and you are talking about FOILs,
17 I was trying to understand your mindset.

18 FELIX PROCACCI: Item Number 3 - -

19 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Yes, sir.

20 FELIX PROCACCI: There is a proposal, once,
21 again, the proposal is not in the resolutions, um,
22 can I get that, also?

23 TOWN ATTORNEY MACCARONE: Absolutely.

24 FELIX PROCACCI: And, in the future, when
25 you have agreements that spend taxpayers'

1 money, it would be helpful, I know, in accordance
2 with the law to provide these agreements so people
3 can review them so - - because I like to see what
4 we are getting for our money when I see and
5 agreement not only how much it is going to be
6 spent, but, you know, the conditions under those
7 agreements.

8 So, it would be helpful if you do that in
9 the future, thank you so much.

10 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Thank you, Mr.
11 Procacci, nice to see you, as always.

12 Next, I have Ms. Mereday.

13 Good Morning, name and address for the
14 record. Thank you.

15 META MEREDAY: Ha, ha, ha, good morning,
16 still morning, isn't it?

17 Um, you have my name, you just said it, so,
18 it is already on the record.

19 We will go with that for, now.

20 Where does one begin in this era of
21 rollbacks and setbacks, um, we are here, once,
22 again, to address the issues that are impacting
23 our residents.

24 Oh, I am sorry, we are here to address the
25 internal interests of our elected

1 Officials that don't address the interests of our
2 residents.

3 An item of concern - - since you are not
4 looking at me, I don't have to, necessarily, look ^{Page | 19}
5 at you, I can look at the people who, um voted
6 most of you in, you know, after many of you got
7 appointed and just kind of used the power of
8 promotion to maintain that position.

9 But I am just always interested in when we
10 talk about resolutions and authorizing purchases,
11 love the fact that we got that event cancellation,
12 rain insurance for the "Salute to Veterans," but
13 we still limit the support system on a daily basis
14 for our Veterans.

15 And, why is that?

16 We brag about the number of Veterans that
17 we have, here, in the Town of Hempstead but, yet,
18 still 1 in 4 are still homeless.

19 The V.A. just put out a notification there
20 is a spike in Veteran suicides at twenty-five
21 percent when we are already talking about, at
22 least, forty-four Veterans either attempted or
23 actually committed suicide.

24 Just, yesterday, three men, not sure if
25 they were Veterans, but three

1 men jumped in front of a subway train in New York
2 City.

3 We have a problem.

4 We have a problem.

5 I am standing before a delegation that does
6 not represent me or my interests and, now, the
7 Supreme Court is saying that I don't have a right
8 to challenge that based upon the criminatory
9 practices of our four hundred years that impacted
10 me, a person of color and a woman.

11 We have a problem.

12 So, before anybody tells me that this is
13 not what I am here to talk about, you are wrong.

14 Before anybody tells me that I need to
15 speak about a specific issue when the issue is not
16 going to get addressed anyway, you're wrong.

17 So, the fact that I am standing, here with
18 combat boots on, just to let you know, the
19 residents are getting ready.

20 You many not see the, here, because they
21 have to work the two and three jobs.

22 And, I am very disappointed and not
23 surprised that the lone representation that you
24 have with the three titles sitting there have yet
25 to speak about an issue that put

1 her in that same position.

2 She has got, now, job insecurity. The rest
3 of us - -

4 (Whereupon, the three-minute bell rang. Page | 21
5 After, the following ensued.)

6 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: Thank you, Ms. Mereday.

7 Thank you for not addressing anything on
8 the Administrative Calendar.

9 Anybody else that did not sign in that
10 would like to speak on the Administrative
11 Calendar?

12 Ms. Chase, you signed in. Okay, good
13 morning, Ms. Chase, if you would give your name
14 and address for the record. Thank you.

15 STEPHANIE CHASE: Good Morning. My name is
16 Stephanie Chase.

17 I am from the Hamlet of Lakeview.

18 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: How are you doing?

19 STEPHANIE CHASE: Um, we, um, some of the
20 residents, NAACP, we have concerns about the
21 landscape maintenance, overgrown trees, grass and
22 weeds located on the intersection of Peninsula
23 Boulevard and Lakeview Avenue, um, North and South
24 side of the street, it is just really overgrown
25 and unkept.

1 Um, it was where the Bay project was and it
2 needs to be maintained.

3 It is just really horrific, trees
4 overgrown, um, and the sidewalk should be on the Page | 22
5 South side of the street but people, you know,
6 people have to walk into the street.

7 Um, also, I am concerned with the blight on
8 Eagle Avenue and Woodfield Road.

9 Um, I don't know what is going on there.

10 It wasn't an apartment and, unfortunately,
11 a building that burned down and right, now, all
12 sorts of junk, construction, is in this yard.

13 I guess they bought the property but it
14 looks horrific in a residential area.

15 It is just horrible.

16 Also, there is a strip of stores, um, half
17 of them are occupied and the other half, it is
18 just empty and the owner does not keep the
19 property up.

20 Um, I just wish that you would look into
21 this situation.

22 I don't know why, it just seems odd that in
23 the middle of the African American neighborhood,
24 that is really pretty nice, all of a sudden it is
25 blighted.

1 And, um, I would just wish that you would
2 look into it.

3 Thank you.

4 SUPERVISOR CLAVIN: First off, my Building Page | 23
5 Commissioner is going to follow you in the back
6 and take a look at that property is.

7 Is anybody here from Highway?

8 Peninsula Boulevard is a County road, right
9 and Lakeview is a - - they are both County roads.

10 So, we will reach out to the County to find
11 out if they can clean up that area.

12 And, I know the State did work down there.

13 They were a little messy, I did notice that
14 myself.

15 So, we will follow-up and ask the County to
16 trim the trees and maintain the roads, so, they
17 are nicer in that area.

18 Okay, thank you.

19 Is there anybody that did not sign in that
