 - For a permit for a new building or structure, or for the alteration of an existing building or structure, if the estimated cost does not exceed \$1,000, then the fee shall be \$200 for residential and \$400 for commercial; if the estimated cost equals or exceeds \$1,000, then fee shall be \$200 for residential and \$400 for commercial plus \$18 for each additional \$1,000 or fraction thereof of the estimated cost.
 - (2) For a permit for a building or structure or for the alteration of an existing building or structure where construction has been undertaken prior to the issuance of a building permit, if the cost did not exceed \$1,000, then the fee shall be \$400; if the cost equaled or exceeded \$1,000, then the fee shall be \$400 for residential and \$800 for commercial plus \$36 for each additional \$1,000 or fraction thereof of cost. For the purpose of this subsection, cost shall be based upon current construction cost calculations. Nothing herein shall be construed as authorizing construction or alterations of any building or structure requiring the issuance of a permit, unless and until a valid permit has been issued by the Department of Buildings therefor.

(6) Approved building permit applications unpaid within 90 days of approval, a fee of \$200 for residential and \$400 for commercial shall be charged for each 90-day extension from the initial expiration.





THIS AGREEMENT, made as of this ______ day of _______, 20____, pursuant to Article 5-G of the General Municipal Law of the state of New York, by and between the TOWN OF HEMPSTEAD, a municipal corporation, located in Nassau County, New York ("Hempstead"), the TOWN OF OYSTER BAY, a municipal corporation, located in Nassau County, New York ("Oyster Bay") and, the OYSTER BAY-HEMPSTEAD JOINT COMMUNITY HALL AND SWIMMING POOL DISTRICT, a special improvement district of the Towns of Oyster Bay and Hempstead, established pursuant to Chapter 835 of the Laws of 1953 ("the Joint District").

I

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Joint District consists of nine (9) parks facilities, seven (7) of which are in Hempstead and two (2) of which are in Oyster Bay; and,

WHEREAS, since 1976, for both efficiency and economy, the facilities of the Joint District are administered, operated and maintained by Hempstead's Department of Parks and Recreation (the "Department"), and Oyster Bay reimburses Hempstead; and,

WHEREAS, Hempstead's and Oyster Bay's previous agreement regarding the Joint District expired on December 31, 2021, and Hempstead, Oyster Bay, and the Joint District desire to again renew the agreement for a five-year term;

IT IS HEREBY MUTUAL COVENANTED AND AGREED,

FIRST: The facilities of the Joint District shall be administered, operated and maintained by Hempstead in the same manner and to the same extent as if the Joint District was a special district of Hempstead established pursuant to Article 12 of the Town Law. Hempstead may acquire, by purchase or gift, material and equipment; contract for as may be necessary; staff; and raising debt for capital improvements; except as hereinafter expressly provided. Hempstead shall have the use and control of all the properties, facilities and equipment of the Joint District.

SECOND: The Hempstead Supervisor shall have custody of the funds of the Joint District as treasurer and the authority to disburse such funds for the lawful purposes of the Joint District, including the charges or fees fixed by the Joint District for use of the Joint District facilities. The books of account of the Joint District shall be kept by the Hempstead Town Comptroller and shall be available for inspection by the Joint District.

THIRD: Hempstead shall have the authority to legislate and enforce such rules and regulations as may be adopted by Hempstead for the facilities of the Joint District. The Department shall issue all permits, when required, for the use of the Joint District's facilities.

FOURTH: The costs of the Joint District shall be divided between Hempstead and Oyster Bay such that Hempstead's proportional share of the Joint District's costs and expenses shall be 87%, and Oyster Bay's proportional share of the Joint District's costs and expenses shall be 13%. Hempstead shall raise and approve the funds necessary for the operation and improvement of the Joint District. Oyster Bay shall pay to Hempstead 13% of Hempstead's adopted total

appropriations for the Joint District, the first-half of the annual amount on or by March 31, and the second-half of the annual amount on or by September 30, of the adopted total appropriations' fiscal year. Oyster Bay shall pay its 2022 share of \$703,788.80, its 2023 of \$720,312.06, and its first-half amount for 2024 of \$389,330.31, for a total of \$1,813,431.17, by March 29, 2024.

FIFTH: Hempstead shall defend and indemnify Oyster Bay against any and all claims arising out of this agreement and the use of the properties, facilities, and equipment of the Joint District.

SIXTH: This agreement shall be for a term beginning January 1, 2022 and terminating on December 31, 2026, shall be subject to all necessary approvals of the respective Towns, and may be renewed by mutual agreement for a successive period of five years by Hempstead, Oyster Bay, and the Joint District, subject to Town Board authorization of same.






